The Sustainable Development Goals The Sendai Framework The Paris Agreement



The EU adaptation strategy

Deals with adaptation and resilience...

- Based on sectoral vulnerabilities according to MS priorities
- From policy point of view, on EU, international, regional, national and local levels
- In an integrated way

This means that financial instruments are <u>part of the</u> <u>whole package</u>

Mainstreaming into funds, financial mechanisms and budgets

20% of the EU budget: climate related expenditures

• Research and innovative approaches to close our knowledge gap

35% of the Horizon 2020 (€80 bln) research programme: climate related ⁵



Member States take Action

First priority in the Adaptation Strategy:

Member states embed adaptation to climate change in their national decision-making, policies, strategies

The aim: each Member State drafts a **National Adaptation Strategy** by 2017.



23 Member States have already realised their Strategies





The new Covenant of Mayors for Climate & Energy: the supporting initiative by cities for cities



2015: New commitments

6,500+ signatory cities now pledge to:

Reduce CO₂ (and possibly other GHG) emissions by at least 40% by 2030

Increase their resilience by adapting to the impacts of climate change

Translate their political commitment into local results by developing local action plans and reporting on their implementation



Funding and financing

Beyond **policies**, adaptation to climate change is mainstreamed into **EU funds** and financial instruments

EU Budget 2014-2020

At least 20% ($\approx \in 200$ bln) of the expenditure must be climate-related. This includes adaptation)

European Structural and Investment Fund 'Climate proofing' of projects, promoting climate change adaptation, risk prevention and management



LIFE & H2020

Cross-border **floods** management, coastal management, urban environment, mountain and island areas, **drought-**prone areas (water, desertification, fire risks) H2020 \rightarrow 35% climate related!

- or an investment in an equity fund

Insurance of natural and man-made disasters

- Policy needs explored in 2013
- Link to climate change: under construction
 - Mechanisms leading to risk reduction: local action by the insurance taker
 - Optimizing efficiency in using insurance
 - Data interoperability and risk disclosure
 - Closing the coverage gap

HORA in Austria: a natural catastrophe risk awareness tool

Mission Risques Naturelles in France:

- Levy on the premium (currently 12%) finances the major natural risk prevention fund this fund subsidizes various individual or group prevention measures
- Studies and works to comply with national risk requirements
