- ii) Familiarising the participants with the accreditation toolkit and workflow**
- iii) Discussing an example of a completed application form**



# Workshop Objectives .. contd

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**Enable participants to better comprehend the project cycle and the process of project design**



# Pre-workshop survey results

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- 25 responses
- 12 countries (48%) reported having established a Designated Authority
- 20 countries (80%) reported limited to no knowledge of the accreditation for NIEs under the AF
- 21 countries (84%) reported that their countries are planning to seek accreditation for a NIE under the AF between 2012 and 2013
  - Main reason for not applying: Not sure of value of NIE vs. MIE



# Pre-workshop survey results (cont.)

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- Challenges to selection of NIE and to preparation of NIE application:
  - Lack of institutional capacity, including limited trained human resources
  - Need for coordination among government institutions
  - Stringent accreditation approval process
  - Difficulty in selecting the appropriate organization
  - Countries used to implementing activities through MIEs

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- Further topics to be discussed:
  - Major differences between working with MIEs, RIEs or NIEs
  - Capacity-building needs for new NIEs
  - Required operational and procedural policies and practices
    - Requirements for expertise in international tendering and accounting systems
