Adaptation activity	<p>The retreat of glaciers and consequent morphological transformations are already impacting Italian alpine areas, with projected climate change expected to exacerbate these impacts. The disappearance of several hiking trails and ice climbing opportunities have caused hikers to leave some areas, resulting in lower socio-economic benefits from tourism. One intervention by Rifugio Dorigoni, a mountain hut facility in the region, has been the creation of new</p>

	routes on land previously covered with ice. This can lead to a viable alternative to address the decline of tourism from more limited ice climbing and skiing opportunities in a warming climate.
Cost-benefit	Expansion of hiking and mountaineering opportunities will increase the number of hikers on new or redesigned routes and bring improved business for facilities in the area, especially those connecting networks of hiking trails, such as the Rifugio Dorigoni mountain hut.
