Expected outcomes


- Enhanced capacity for V&A assessment

New focus of the 2nd phase

- Organizations active at the community level, undertaking education, training, and awarenessraising
- Activities by regional centres and new/existing networks
- Outreach efforts
 - User-friendly knowledge products and accessible forms for dissemination
 - Aiming at practitioners at national/subnational levels in developing countries
 - Foster dialogue and information exchange

Recent workshops

- Integrating climate risk assessment and management, and DRR strategies into national policies and programmes
 - 10-12 March, Cuba
 - Collaboration with UNISDR
 - Experts from adaptation, DRR and development planning
- Increasing economic resilience to climate change
 - 28-30 April, Egypt
 - Expertise from the private sector, NGOs/IGOs with on-the-ground experience

Common messages

- Enabling environment/factors are critical
- The development and dissemination of knowledge and information need to be strengthened
- The consideration of social aspects is essential
- Regional cooperation plays a key role
