 - Use of M&E systems, including how to integrate diverse forms of knowledge and multi-stakeholder participatory approaches, pulling lessons and key messages from the joint workshop with NWP on local and traditional knowledge, as appropriate;
- Explore collaboration with the LEG in the further development of the PEG M&E tool.

The AC may also wish to use the suggested next steps in its elaboration of draft recommendations and guidance on this matter for consideration by COP 20.
