




Increase the resilience of women, men and young people in Vanuatu to the impacts of climate change

#### **Key Messages towards Resilience**

- Community participation throughout the program cycle and reflections at multiple levels contributes to learning and builds resilience
- Draw on and build diverse sources of knowledge traditional and scientific
- Participatory approaches with multiple stakeholders joint reflection, joint analysis and peer-to-peer learning
- Learning to understand multiple shocks, stresses and hazards to avoid maladaptation
- · Emphasis on addressing inequality/rights/structural causes
