# L&D Regional experiences and needs

## Experiences in Latin America

- Regional initiatives organized around shared resources
  - Water (Andes)
  - Land use management
  - Natural resources, including biodiversity (Mesoamerica)
- Regional intiatives organized around political priorities
  - CARICOM
  - Disaster risk management, disaster risk finance
  - Food security (MFEWS)
- Regional initiatives organized around networks
  - Information (CCRIF, CIMH, RIOCC, CIIFEN, drought monitoring)
  - Risk management (CEPREDENAC)
  - water

## Priorities LAC perspectives

- Shared resources but also shared vulnerabilities
- Capacity, technical expertise sharing, facilitating collaboration
- Financial resources for action (making case for finance)
- Go beyond extreme events to address climate stressors that cause L&D (prepare for longterm change, do both better)
- Deal with unavoidable large losses → stable paths to the future, safety nets

# Thematic areas, work needed

- Water: drought, glacial and river systems
- Population distribution, migration framework
- Livelihood, sectorial impacts
- Food security
- Early warning systems and how to translate information into political action

# Linkages & Synergies (LAC)

### Functions of regional approaches

- Collaborate to increase understanding
- Capacity in specific areas (share, build)
- Coordination of policies
- Joint funding initiatives

### Combinations of approaches

- Synergies in using platforms, building on platforms (like using disaster risk reduction, social safety nets, expanding information to facilitate risk transfer and risk reduction)
- Level of awareness grows with collaboration
- Need variety of groups to collaborate (Ministries, risk mgr, climate information, etc.)
- Regional groups: help in sectoral coordination
- Need: lessons learned from other regions: what is there,
  what could be improved upon, kind of support still needed

# Toolkits, enabling environment

- Regional convenor: bring networks together, drive collaboration
- Financial resources: linked with established institutions at scale
- Private sector engagement: guidance, support national legislation
- Need monitoring: inform region and countries, international community, tipping elements, early warning
- Need to connect: information, decisions, action
