# Goal of Approach:

**Objective**: to address the potential risk of agricultural production and food security from future climate change **Tool:** regional climate model, crop model

# Main elements of the implementation strategy

- 1. to employ the regional climate model for downscaling the global climate model's scenario projections
- 2. to use *in situ* climate observation data for model's validation
- 3. Based on the model's validation, the correction on the generated climate scenarios with gridded climate baseline observation data is done
- 4. to use crop field experimental data for crop models' validation and the determination of genetic coefficients
- 5. to feed the crop model s to simulate the changes of crop yield due to future climate change
- 6. to determine the criteria for food security and the risk grade of crop production
- 7. to address the potential risk of crop production and risk of food supply security from the crop models' simulation with the determined criteria and risk grade

## Targeted beneficiaries

Key beneficiaries: policy makers, local authorities, the farmers

**Benefits**: based on the risk assessment, the high risk areas identified, the risk factors isolated, and the agricultural adaptation strategy is developed

### Any significant lessons learned

The time-series for the observation data is short, especially for the crop field experiment data; and the long-term crop observation station is few, and the matching for the climate observation station and the crop observation station is not well

## **Resource requirements**

**Data needs**: high-quality gridded climate data with more variables, especially for solar radiation; more data for crop field experiment

Capacity needs: user-friendly crop models, user-friendly climate scenarios, platform for data exchange

Financial resources: national foundation, international co-operation

### Potential for replication or scaling-up

The methodology could be shared in the South-South cooperation
