

Registration:

Participants are required to register and obtain identification badges prior to the opening of the meeting on Monday, 29 August 2012 from 8:00 to 9:00 a.m. For this purpose, a registration counter will be set up in front of the meeting room to be announced at the lobby of the UNCC. In order to have access to UNCC, please bring your passport to the meeting.

Health requirements:

We recommend that you consult the appropriate health authorities in your country well in advance in connection with possible vaccinations and health precautions for Thailand.

The Thai Ministry of Public Health has issued regulations that applicants who have travelled from or through the countries which have been declared yellow fever infected areas must provide an International Health Certificate proving that they have received a yellow fever vaccination. The International Health Certificate must be submitted together with the visa application form. The traveller will also have to present the said certificate to the Immigration Officer upon arrival at the port of entry in the Kingdom.

General information

Geography:

Thailand is situated in the heart of the Southeast Asian mainland, covering an area of 513,115 square kilometers, and extends about 1,620 kilometers from north to south and 775 kilometers from east to west. Thailand borders the Lao People's Democratic Republic and the Union of Myanmar to the North, the Kingdom of Cambodia and the Gulf of Thailand to the East, the Union of Myanmar and the Indian Ocean to the West, and Malaysia to the south.

Official language:

The official language in Thailand is Thai. However, English is widely spoken and understood in most hotels and restaurants.

Time zone:

Standard time zone: UTC/GMT +7 hours; no daylight saving time in 2012.

Tipping is not a usual practice in Thailand although it is becoming more common. Most hotels and restaurants add a 10% service charge to the bill. Taxi drivers do not require a tip, but the gesture is appreciated and 10 to 20 Baht is acceptable for porters.
