## 1. Informed policy setting and action through strengthened information and data

- Promoting standardization of methodologies or guidance for countries on how to collect, generate, analyse and track climaterelated loss and damage (historic and future)
- Calling for the establishment of monitoring or tracking systems to routinely collect climate-related loss and damage data for analysis
- Initiating the assessment of needs for addressing gaps in current methodologies and systems
- Continuing to advocate and promote international support for efforts at all levels to collect, track and maintain the information and corresponding capacity development support to ensure effective institutionalization and financing of these efforts

## 2. Enhanced institutional alignment and joint action across disciplines and scales

- Establishing a multi-disciplinary group with representatives from across different issue areas, to share information and best practices from their field
- Advocating for better aligned funding streams to ensure joint action is supported at the national/sub-national level
- Understanding the linkages between existing frameworks
- Keeping track of existing institutional arrangements related to loss and damage, drawing on the initial mapping done by UNFCCC, in a dynamic and interactive way
