Activity 6(a): Invite relevant organizations and experts to provide scientific information on projected migration and displacement based on projected climate and non-climate related impacts in vulnerable populations

Process from Excom 2 to date

- During Excom 2*
- Developed a draft letter of invitation and an initial list of recipients;
 - Agreed to finalize the documents intersessionally.
- Intersessionally*
- The group of champions revised the draft letter of invitation and shared it with the Excom on 10 March, soliciting comments by 19 March.
- 30 Mar*
- The letter, as cleared by the co-chairs, was sent to the organizations as agreed by the Excom; disseminated through the Nansen Initiative mailing list; announced through the Climate-L mailing list; made publicly available online at www.unfccc.int/9503.
 - Deadline for submissions is by 16 May 2016.
- 22 Apr*
- 7 organizations and experts submitted 19 sets of information as at 22 April (*Available online at www.unfccc.int/9508*).
 - More details contained in the reference document prepared for Excom 3.

Next steps

The Excom may wish to exchange views on:

- Possible collaboration strategy/modalities, with relevant organizations/stakeholders, to distil relevant information, lessons learned and good practices, in the context of activity (b).
- Possible strategy/modality to identify follow-up actions, in the context of activity (c).

Co-chairs' proposal

The co-chairs propose:

- To organize a workshop/technical meeting with the interested respondents to the invitation under activity (a) of this Action Area, with the aim of synthesizing relevant information and make it available widely, in line with the expected results of this Action Area.
- Excom members may suggest additional relevant participants to be invited.
- Outcomes of the meeting in the context of activity (b) can feed into the work of the task force on displacement.
