Recent and upcoming NWP activities

<u>Technical workshop on water, climate change impacts and adaptation</u> <u>strategies</u>

A technical workshop on water, climate change impacts and adaptation strategies was held in Mexico City, Mexico from 18 to 20 July. The workshop considered issues surrounding climate change impacts on water resources, including multi-dimensional aspects of water in the context of livelihoods, related sectors and ecosystems, data and observation needs and opportunities, and adaptation planning and practices to reduce the vulnerability of water resources at multiple levels. Crosscutting themes included the applicability of indigenous knowledge and coping systems and the need for gender sensitivity to developing inclusive adaptation strategies involving water resources. Participants also discussed the role of stakeholder engagement, knowledge sharing and management, and collaboration at different levels, to enhance the resilience of water resources to climate change. This workshop also led to interactive exchange among participants on the potential direction for future work on water and climate change in the context of the Nairobi work programme.

NWP knowledge products and stakeholder engagement

The interface of the <u>NWP Partners and Action Pledges database</u> is currently being refreshed. This activity will contribute towards implementing mandates contained in decision <u>6/CP.17</u>, on continuing the development of user-friendly knowledge products and outputs; enhancing the dissemination of information and knowledge products developed under the Nairobi work programme; and further engaging stakeholders.

The new system will allow existing NWP Partners to update their information and Action Pledges directly, and allow prospective NWP partners to add initial content about their organization directly to the database. This change aims to streamline knowledge management, and allow NWP partners to update their content more conveniently and efficiently.

The refreshed database will be launched later this year.

2012 Climate and Development Knowledge Brokers Workshop

NWP partners CDKN and GIZ convened their 2012 Climate Knowledge Brokers' Workshop from 18-20 May in Bonn, Germany. Over thirty participants from organizations all over the world attended. The objective of the workshop was to forge closer collaborative links between climate knowledge brokers working in the climate and development area. The workshop provided participants with an opportunity to

improve access to reliable information and robust methods for those working in these sectors, particularly in developing countries, and to enhance their ability to share lessons and experience. See here for CDKN's associated Action Pledge.

Related adaptation progress and activities under the UNFCCC

Progress made during the Bonn session

At the 36th session of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI), progress was made on all Adaptation items, building momentum towards COP 18, with significant steps taken in relation to the process for national adaptation plans (NAPs), least developed country (LDC) matters and the work programme on loss and damage. A draft decision on support for the NAP process in LDCs was developed, to be finalized at COP 18. Parties took note of the work of the Least Developed Countries Expert Group (LEG) in developing technical guidelines for the NAP process, and looked forward to completion of this work by COP 18. In relation to LDC matters, the SBI endorsed a two-year rolling work programme for the LEG, with Parties inviting the Global Environment Facility, relevant organizations and regional centres to support the regional training workshops on adaptation for the LDCs for 2012–2013. All Parties were very positive about the work of the LEG in supporting LDCs. During the May session, the SBI discussed recent progress made under the work programme on loss and damage, including the recent expert meeting in Tokyo, Japan and a technical paper on current knowledge on methodologies for assessing the risk of loss and damage.

Inaugural meeting of the Adaptation Committee

The first meeting of the <u>Adaptation Committee</u> is planned to take place soon after receipt of the pending membership nominations. During its first meeting, the Committee will initiate work on elaborating a three-year work plan, including defining milestones, activities, deliverables and resource requirements, in accordance with its agreed functions, for approval by COP 18. Expert meetings on loss and damage

Expert meetings under the work programme on loss and damage have been successfully held this year in Tokyo, Japan; Addis Ababa, Ethiopia; and Mexico City, Mexico. Further regional-level meetings are mandated to take place before COP 18, one for Asia, and one for small island developing States. Further information is available on http://iunfccc.int/6056>.

Least Developed Countries Expert Group meetings and workshops

The Least Developed Countries Expert Group (LEG) will meet from 26 to 29 September 2012 in Funafuti, Tuvalu; followed by a workshop on adaptation for Pacific Least Developed Countries from 28 September to 3 October 2012, also in Tuvalu. From 29 to 31 October 2012, a technical meeting to review the draft NAP guidelines will be held in Bonn, Germany.
