Knowledge Management

- Develop strategies that will distinguish/address knowledge generation and dissemination
- Develop programmes that will serve to transfer knowledge into action and policy
- Create capacity (including institutional capacity) for sustainable self-reliance/ self improvement by providing access to information
- Evaluate the appropriateness of different research and methodologies to the creation of knowledge reflective of indigenous experiences
- Inventories/meta-databases that show provenance of data and products, linking to vulnerability assessments that identify fitness for purpose, information content, and limits of applicability in the context of Ecosystem based adaptation

Stakeholder Engagement

- Better communications materials written/prepared to reach out to different communities (such as, Engineers, Economists, Youth – Social Media)
- Stressing benefits to people
 - socio economic and biophysical,
 - tangible and intangible,
 - short and longer term benefits.
 - Direct and Indirect
- Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA) needs to be a two way process
- An environment (multiple stakeholder platform) must be created so as to bring as many people as possible
