- Provide practical scientific and technical information to support adaptation decision making under uncertainties.

- · Local and indigenous knowledge and traditional coping strategies;
- Demographic implications of climate change;
- Socio-economic impacts of adaptation policies;
- Adaptation metrics for vulnerability assessments;
- · Role of women;
- Water resource management;









2. Suggestions – Thematic and work areas (cont.)

- Community-based adaptation;
- Integration of natural systems adaptation planning and practices
- · Methods and tools
- Integration of climate change adaptation into sustainable development
- · Costs and benefits of adaptation options;
- Technologies for adaptation;
- Adaptation financing



2. Suggestions – Knowledge outputs and products

Knowledge content

- More **targeted** (i.e. sector-, region-, issue-specific);
- **Practical guidance** on adaptation approaches, methods and tools;
- User-friendly **synthesis** products;
- · Policy maker-oriented;
- Policy feedback on outcomes of the NWP







2. Suggestions – Knowledge outputs and products (cont.)

Knowledge dissemination

- Strengthened efforts towards developing countries, particularly LDCs and SIDS;
- · More accessible;
- More effective **collaboration** with regional centres and networks;
- Targeted events
