Employment and income

- Limit the harm – seize the opportunities
- Vulnerability of the poor: = Working poor
- Understanding of economic and social systems



Ex: Cyclone Sidr Bangladesh

- > 500,000 jobs affected
- 75 % household farm
- Only 35% hh main income agriculture
- Most affected: subsistence farmers + wage workers
- Resilient: non-agricultural income
- Damage to income generating assets
- Credit crunch (assets)




Ex: Semi-arid Bangladesh
(source FAO 2006)

Household income:


Agriculture	40%
Agricultural labour	34%
Non-agr. Labour	4%
Other work	15%
Non-work	7%

Adaption: switch rice to mango
-> Sharp contraction demand for labour



Livelihoods + incomes


- **LIVELIHOODS = SUM OF WAYS PEOPLE MAKE A LIVING**
=> JOBS, EMPLOYMENT AND INCOME
- IMPORTANT LIVELIHOOD OUTCOME: SOCIO-ECONOMIC SECURITY, RESILIENCE
- **KEY DETERMINANT FOR OTHER OUTCOMES:**
 - SHELTER
 - FOOD, WATER
 - HEALTH
 - EDUCATION
 - ETC.



Employment/income – adaptation


Transmission mechanisms

- Resilience
- Coping strategies
- 'Second round': e.g. migration
- Response to planned adaptation
- Diversification




Data required: employment

- By sector (ISIC)
- by gender
- Status (formal/informal)
- Income quintile
- Skilled/unskilled




Data required: households

- Household income/expenditure:
 - By income quintile
 - Urban/rural
 - Indigenous/non-indigenous
 - Female headed
- Main source of household income
- Household assets (savings)
- Organizations




Data required: enterprises

- Location
- Sector of activity
- Size distribution (no employees)
- Assets



Data sources

- Census
- National accounts
- Living standards surveys
- Labour force surveys
- Establishment surveys

- Key informants: communities, employers' organizations, trade unions ...



Assessments & planning

- Macro + micro (local)
- Social accounting matrices (SAM) + employment series
- Computable models CGE
- Regional/local assessments
- Local economic development
