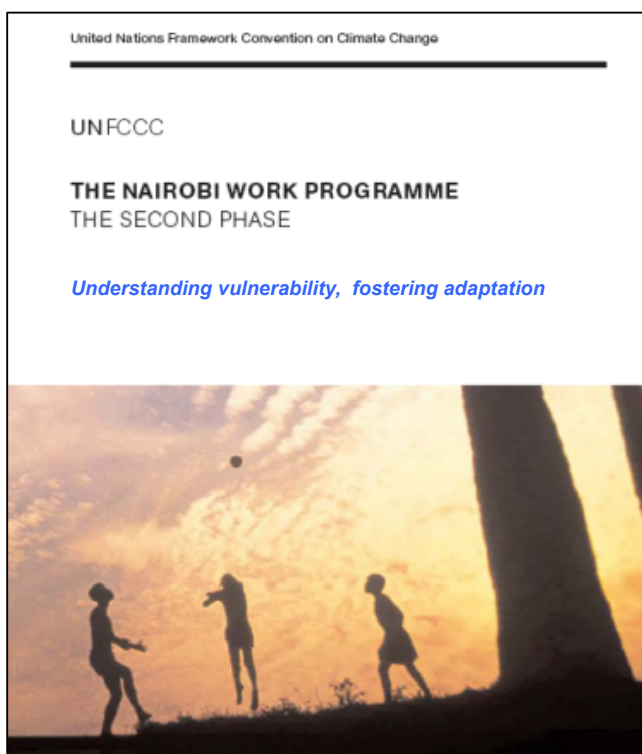


**UNFCCC event on the

The Nairobi work programme on impacts, vulnerability and adaptation to climate change is a 5 year programme (2005–2010) implemented by a diverse range of stakeholders, including: Parties, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, communities and the private sector.

With the wide support and participation of Parties and organizations gained through the implementation of its first phase (November 2006 to June 2008), the Nairobi work programme is in full swing.

The Nairobi work programme has now over **130 partner organizations who are working together in implementing the work programme.**

This event will inform Parties and organizations of the highlights and progress of the implementation of the work programme, and facilitate the exchange of views on the opportunities and challenges for generating and delivering knowledge and expertise to the stakeholders at the community and national levels through the Nairobi work programme.

The **objective of the Nairobi work programme** is to assist all Parties, in particular developing countries, including the least developed countries and small island developing States to:

- Improve their understanding of impacts, vulnerability and adaptation to climate change;
- Make informed decisions on practical adaptation actions to respond to climate change.
