





Challenges

- Need to improve diffusion of science to policy and implementation, and clear identification of beneficiaries/intended end users.
- Unclear mandates on how to collaborate and differences in motivation or incentives
- Differences in requests by Parties in different COPs, little coordination between different culti-lateral processes, leading to overlaps, and conflicting mandates
- Need for coordination within big organizations. And who takes lead/initiative

Opportunities for Integration & Coordination Resolutions from tGOs general assemblies, COPs and SBs move knowledge from university to policy-makers incentive for organizations to cooperate by funding agencies
