Statement by Algeria at the opening plenary of the session 2.6 of the ADP

Bonn, 20 October 2014

Co-chairs,

- 1. Algeria supports the statement delivered by Sudan on behalf of the African Group, the one delivered by Bolivia on behalf of the Group of 77 and China and the statement pronounced by Ecuador on behalf of the Like Minded Group of Developing Countries.
- 2. Algeria appreciates the effort you made to reconcile the points of view of the Parties to the UNFCCC.
- 3. We reaffirm that the process have to be open, transparent, inclusive and Party-driven. The Outcome expected shall reflect views and inputs from Parties. This is the main condition to have successful COPs in Lima and Paris.

Co-chairs,

- 4. On your non paper, we recognize the amount of effort made to achieve such document that can allow us to move forward in the negotiation. But we emphasize the fact that the CRPs produced by some Parties remains on the table.
- **5.** On the draft decision related to INDCs, this document has not been discussed by the Parties and does not reflect compromise within them. The paragraph 2 of the Decision 1/CP.19, adopted in Warsaw, deals only with the identification of information that INDCs could contain. The mandate does not provide for expanding the discussion with respect to INDCs to issues such as ex ante or ex post assessment or review. The INDCs have to take into consideration mitigation, and the other elements of the mandate, namely adaptation, means of implementation and transparency of action and support.

Co-Chairs,

6. Concerning workstream II, enhancing mitigation ambition requires the fulfillment of the developed country Parties commitments, especially to comply with the CP2 under the KP. In this context, we reaffirm that we must stick to the Convention avoiding any transfer of commitments and obligations from developed countries to developing countries.

- 7. In addition, we would like to emphasize that workstream II is not only about mitigation, it also concerns the provision of means of implementation, including technology transfer, finance and capacity building support for developing country Parties. Such implementation allows enhancing ambition in the pre-2020 period. This is the reason why we believe that paragraph 3 of decision 1/CP.19 is important for; it should then, from our perspective, be fully reflected in Lima.
- 8. We would like to remind that Algeria is ready to work with you and all Parties, for making our work successful.
