COP 19 invited all Parties to initiate or intensify domestic preparations for their intended nationally determined contributions and to communicate them well in advance of COP 21. It also urged and requested developed country Parties, the operating entities of the financial mechanism and any other organizations in a position to do so to provide support for the related activities referred to above.

In response to this request, some initiatives and co-operation are underway to support countries in the process of preparing and putting forward their INDCs.

The purpose of this briefing meeting is to highlight case studies on cooperation and support to address technical and political challenges relating to the preparation of INDCs.
