

Adaptation action through NAPAs and NAPs – key messages

- LDCs have been designing and implementing concrete adaptation actions mainly through land-based activities
 - Approximately 45% of NAPA projects in forestry, agriculture, ecosystems



 As with other adaptation actions, quantifying co-benefits in reducing vulnerability in the short-term, is a challenge, although benefits towards sustainable development are easy to see and articulate



Example of NAPA project co-benefits

Mauritania: Support to the adaptation of agricultural production systems

Component 2. Improve the resilience of livestock farming and animal production systems in oasis and semi-arid areas, through e.g.

- Promotion of climate change resilient rangeland and pasture management techniques
- Promotion of intensive production and conservation of green forage supported by an integrated livestock/cropping system

Nepal: Catalyzing Ecosystem Restoration for Resilient Natural Capital and Rural Livelihoods in Degraded Forests and Rangelands of Nepal

Component 3: Demonstration of measures that reduce vulnerability and restore natural capital

 Expected outcome: Increased resilience of local mid-hill and high mountain communities in Achham, Salyan and Dolakha districts to increased temperatures, reduced water availability and intense rainfall events through restoration of degraded forests and rangelands.
