## Proposals for enhancing existing means of participation

- Preserving and strengthening what has worked well
- Building on existing arrangements, e.g. the communication channel between the Secretariat and the focal points;
- Retaining the NGO guidelines;
- Continuing progress to increase value and effectiveness of engagement for government delegations and observers
- encourage informal dialogues such as the public-private Mexican Dialogues or the Business Days through acknowledgement and participation;


## Proposals for enhancing existing means of participation

- Exploring how the existing models can be enhanced by new technologies and innovative approaches, such as
- the new on-line registration system
- news flashes - also for the constituencies, e.g. on interventions;
- web page for each constituency where the Secretariat can put information accessible to all;
- During meetings (COP and SB) all online applications should be maintained - we would propose:
- documents should be uploaded online at the same time when they are distributed so everyone can have access to them;
- existing IPad application - which is very useful - should be well maintained during COPs;
- good online connection;
- extending broadcasting of meetings on CCTV;
- However, while new technologies can address some challenges of participation, they cannot be substitute for in-person attendance and should not be used as a justification for limiting public participation.
- Ensuring that business from around the world can participate and be heard
- We suggest the SBI to explore possibilities for observers to allow better access, for example
- through new technology possibilities allowing for "virtual interactions" where appropriate,
- and opportunities for capacity building, including through partnership between the UNFCCC Secretariat and constituencies;
