#### Mandate

The COP, at its thirteenth session, requested the secretariat to convene, before the fourteenth session of the Conference of the Parties, a meeting to discuss experiences in using performance indicators for the monitoring and evaluation of capacity-building at the national level, consistent with the capacity-building framework<sup>1</sup>.

### **Objectives**

The objectives of the workshop are:

- Share experiences in the application of performance indicators in monitoring and evaluating capacity-building activities at the national level including practical examples of such activities;
- Share experiences and lessons learned in approaches used in monitoring and evaluating capacitybuilding in various fields, in order to explore how such methods could be applied to capacitybuilding for climate change;
- Discuss potential conceptual frameworks for development and application of performance indicators for capacity-building for climate change under the Convention at the national and global levels.
