## Capacity as the front end of the mitigation pipeline

3rd Durban Forum on Capacity Building, Bonn, 12th June 2014

SBI Chair's 'take home message' DFCB-1, June 2012:

'Capacity comes first when it comes to addressing climate change.

It is not possible to get results without action.

And it is not possible to get action without capacity.'

CAPACITY -> ACTION -> RESULTS

[CAPACITY BUILDING → ] CAPACITY → ACTION → RESULTS

CB is the front end of the implementation pipeline

Counterfactual: Stalling mitigation (or any) capacity is stalling mitigation (or any) results

**IPCC:** We need results <u>v.v.</u> badly (and soon!)

**CBDR&RC** => Shared objective : co-operation : co-ordination

( <u>Integration</u> ≈ Efficiency ≈ Least cost ≈ Effectiveness ≈ <u>Results</u> )

Co-ordinated and co-operative capacity enhancement is <u>urgently</u> needed by the <u>vast majority</u> of developing countries <u>right now</u> in order for them to:

- Build inventories and develop MRV (e.g. CRF)
- Establish credible projections, scenarios, and baselines
- Assess technology needs, suitability and costs (particularly through time)
  - Establish realistic mitigation potential, affordable costs, and deliverable results (particularly through time)
    - Propose effective NAMA's and/or INDC's effectively (including 'with support' and 'without support' projections)
    - Report and account for MOI support within emergent direct access frameworks ('readiness')
      - Build national policy coherence (\*)

(\*) Integration, synergy, efficiency, and cost effectiveness of mitigation strategies in relation to other basic aspects of effective low-carbon sustainable development - particularly adaptation strategies, poverty elimination, generation and transmission planning, forest, land-use and agriculture management, food security, social aspects etc. etc.)
