



Viewpoints

- INDC is the official information channel to communicate Vietnam's efforts to respond to CC to the world
- INDC does not constitute an international obligation to the country. Its implementation will based on the domestic and external resources.
- IDNC report is based on the current socio-economic conditions and provides projections for the period of 2021-2030. It shall be updated based on national circumstances.

Challenges

- Lack of specific guidelines for INDC (e.g. templates)
- Time shortage, esp. for stakeholder consultation
- Lack of research on the effects of INDC targets on socioeconomic development
- Bottom-up: Difficulties in national target formulation due to diversity of information from each sectors
- Top-down: Lack of criteria for allocation of targets for each sector

Challenges

- Significant investment capital is required, esp. for adaptation and energy-based options to achieve targets
- National MRV system is not yet in place. Legal basis for responsibility of line ministries and stakeholders for national GHG inventory and MRV is still missing
- Coordination mechanism across line ministries and localities, and between public and private sectors are not effective enough to develop and implement cross-sectoral and inter-disciplinary mitigation activities
- Lack of incentives for private sector to invest in RE and adaptation
