GEF Financing: GEF Trust Fund, LDCF and SCCF

- GEF Trust Fund: provides resources to meet the agreed incremental cost of activities that generate <u>global environmental benefits</u> (GEBs), including climate mitigation
- LDCF and SCCF: provide resources to met the additional cost of adaptation aimed at generating <u>adaptation benefits</u>



How parties can access funding: GEF Trust Fund, LDCF and SCCF

- Project concept development
 - Developed by governments, non-governmental organizations, communities, the private sector, or other civil society entities
 - Respond to both national priorities and GEF Trust Fund or LDCF/SCCF strategic objectives
- Project submission
 - Endorsed by national GEF Operational Focal Point
 - Submitted by GEF Agency
- Project approval
 - By GEF CEO if < US\$ 2 million (can be one stop)
 - BY GEF Council if > US\$2 million



GEF Financing: Implementing Article 6 of the UNFCCC

- GEF projects promote education, training and skills development at both local and national levels, thus ensuring overall project sustainability

Burkina Faso (LDCF)

"Strengthening Adaptation Capacities and Reducing the Vulnerability to Climate Change"

Objective:

To enhance Burkina Faso's resilience and adaptation capacity to climate change risks in the agricultural, livestock and water sectors.

• Activities:

- Over 1,500 producers (~40% women) trained on agroforestry-pastoral practices and climate change adaptation
- Media coverage of project through radio broadcasts, newspaper articles, forums, and a documentary film

Egypt (SCCF)

"Adaptation to Climate Change in the Nile Delta through Integrated Coastal Zone Management"

• Objective:

 To integrate sea-level rise into the development of Egypt's Low Elevation Coastal Zone (LECZ) in the Nile Delta

• Activities:

- More than 30 engineers and scientists trained on soft engineering techniques for coastal zone management
- Workshops to assess the current legal and regulatory framework s governing costal zones in Egypt
- Awareness seminars addressing the issue of sea-level rise and its impact on the local populations

Cambodia (LDCF)

"Promoting Climate-Resilient Water Management and Agricultural Practices in Rural Cambodia"

• Objective:

 To reduce the vulnerability of Cambodia's agricultural sector to climate-induced changes in water resources availability

Activities:

- Over 900 women trained on gender and climate change and effective use of water
- Over 200 farmers trained on early warning systems
- Media coverage of project through newspaper pieces, online articles, radio clips and TV interviews

- Supported in all GEF focal areas
- Key foundational elements of GEF support
- High level of integration in project design
