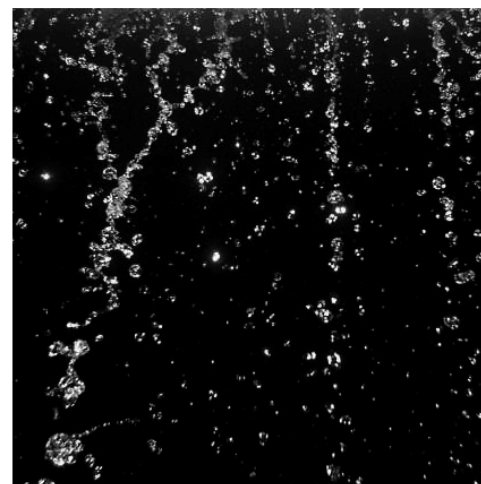

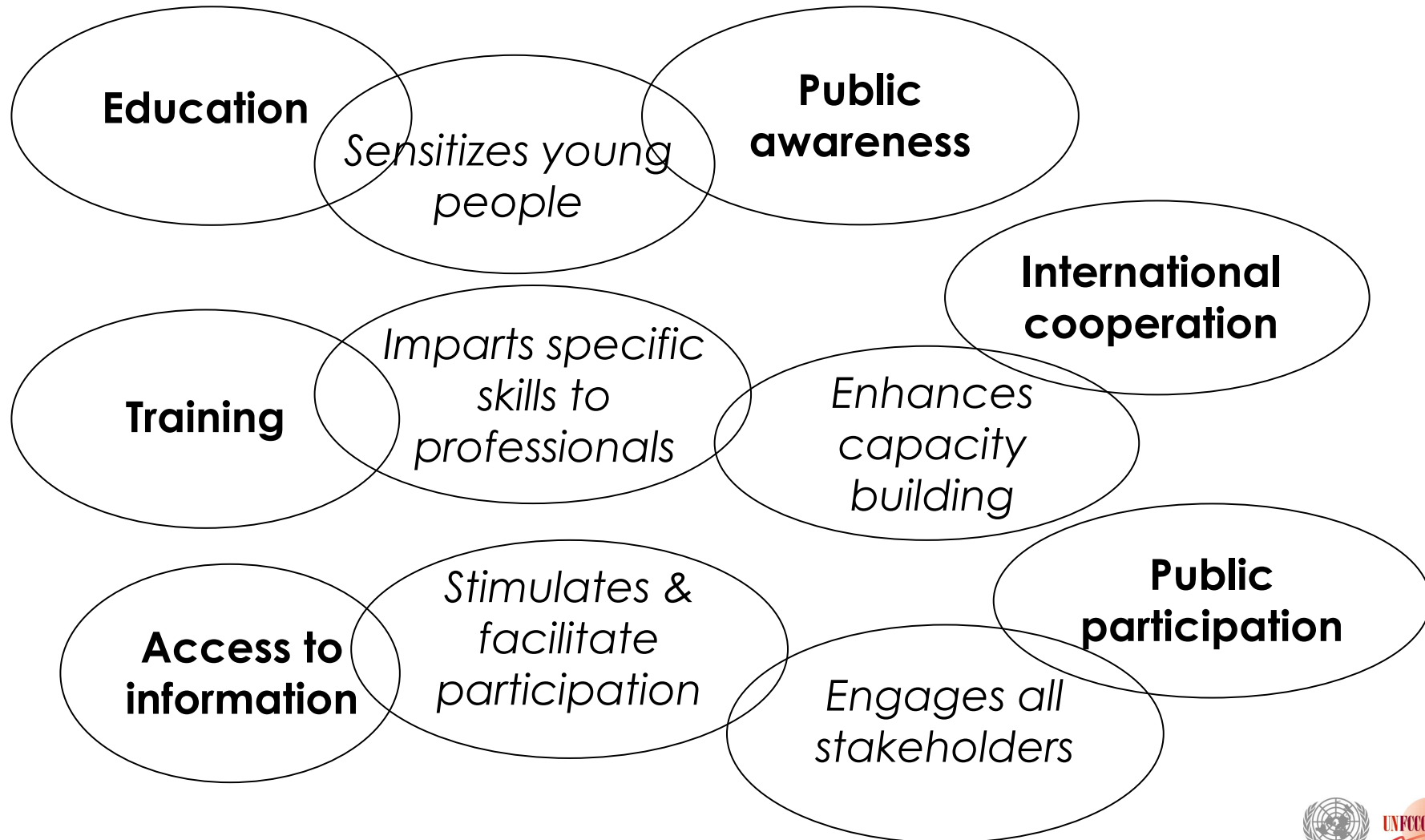

CC Outreach & Education

A key element in Parties' response



- Generate support to policies and measures
- Strengthen institutional and legal frameworks
- Encourage voluntary changes in habits
- Bridge the communication gap between researchers/policy makers
- Promote international cooperation in the context of sustainable development

New Delhi work programme

(Decisions 11/CP.8 and 9/CP.13)

- Five-year work programme on Article 6
 - Country-driven approach
 - Phased approach by integrating Article 6 activities into existing climate change programmes/strategies
 - Promote partnerships
 - Encourage programmatic response by NGOs and IGOS
 - List activities that Parties may wish to implement

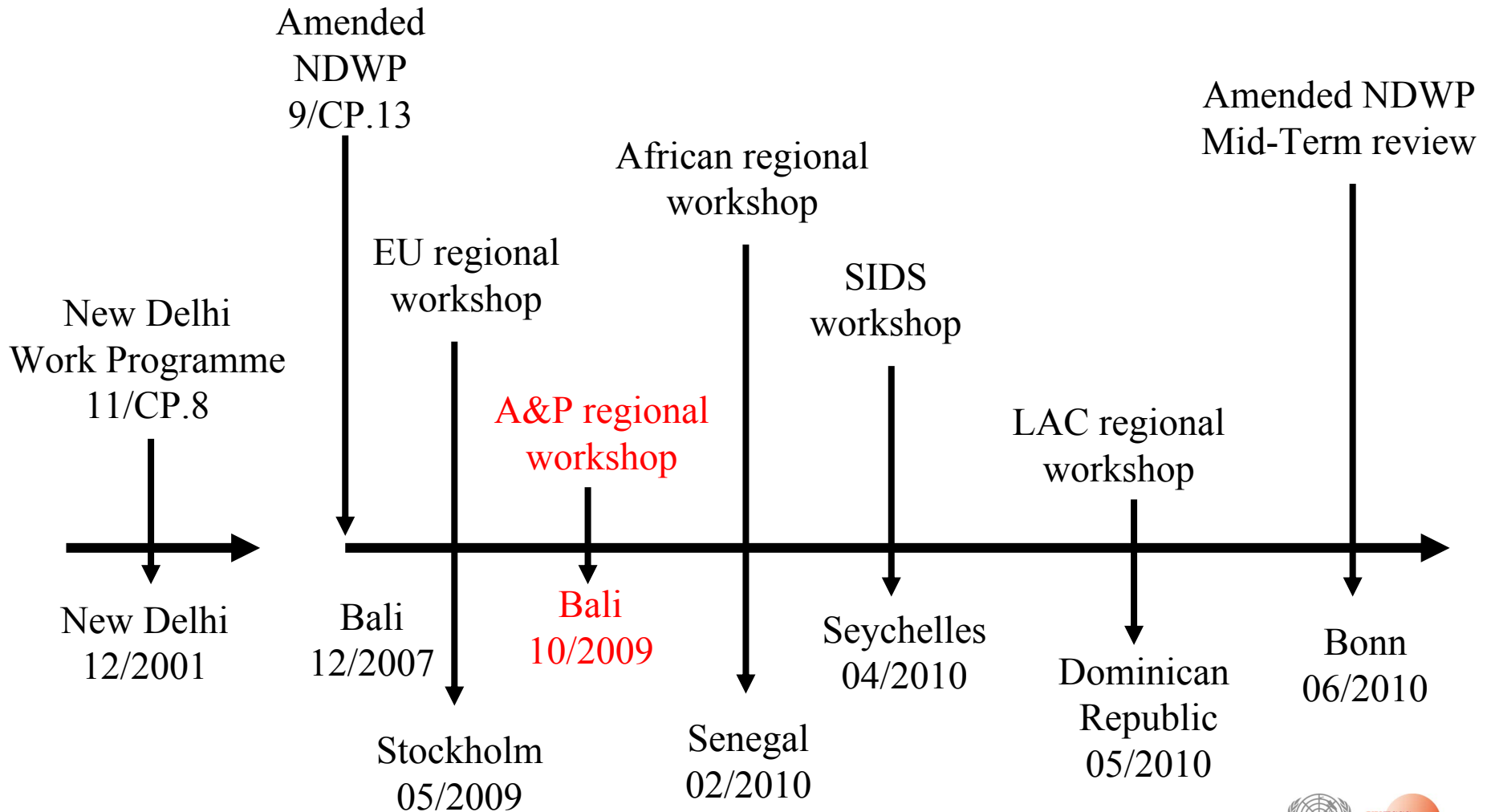
New Delhi work programme

From New Delhi to Bali and beyond...



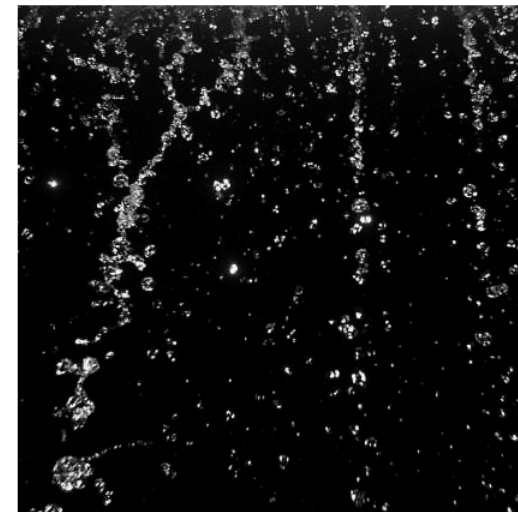
