**Introduction**

1. The Ministry of the Environment of Japan has been convening the Asia-Pacific Seminar on Climate Change since the early 1990s in support of regional efforts to address climate change. The seminar has been steadily growing in significance as a regional forum to promote awareness and exchange experiences on many issues of common interest to Asia-Pacific.
2. Many countries in the Asia-Pacific region, both at a national and international level, have made substantial efforts to address climate change in many ways. The Asia-Pacific Seminar offers an opportunity to discuss these achievements at a regional level, and increase awareness and understanding of the lessons they offer as countries continue to develop their responses to climate change.
3. The Fifteenth Asia-Pacific Seminar on Climate Change will be organized back-to-back with the Asia-Pacific Regional Workshop on Article 6 of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change. In this context, in addition to its regular activities to discuss climate change issues, the Seminar is also expected to provide an effective vehicle for the Regional Workshop, where participants will exchange views and experiences on the issues relating to education, training and public awareness in the field of climate change.

**Purpose and objectives**

5. The objective of the Asia-Pacific Seminar is to provide a forum for the countries of the Asia-Pacific region, as well as international organizations working in the region, to share information and build relationships in an informal working environment. In addition to informative presentations, the seminar programme will allow ample time for questions and discussion, so that all participants can contribute to the proceedings and the opportunities for learning from the experiences of others will be greater.
6. Participants are also encouraged to explore the possibility of providing insights to the

Regional Workshop on Article 6 of the Convention, through the exchange of views and experience in each respective thematic issue to be discussed in the Seminar (see agenda below) .

**Expected outcomes**

7. It is expected that participants will leave the seminar with an enhanced understanding of the breadth of activities in the Asia-Pacific region, and an awareness of the lessons to be learned from the experiences of countries and organizations in the Asia-Pacific region.
8. The proceedings of the seminar will be documented in:
  - 8.1. Chairperson’s Summary, which will include summary of the discussions; and
  - 8.2. Seminar proceedings including Chairperson’s Summary and relevant papers to be presented at the Seminar
9. A separate report will be prepared for the Asia-Pacific Regional Workshop on Article 6 of the Convention.
