CC Outreach & Education A key element in Parties' response

From New Delhi to Bali and beyond...

- December 2001 New Delhi work programme
- December 2004 Intermediate review
- December 2007 Bali
 - Review of the New Delhi Work Programme
 - Agree on an enhanced work programme



New Delhi work programme (Decision 11/CP.8)

- Five-year work programme on Article 6
- Country-driven approach
- Phased approach by integrating Article 6 activities into existing climate change programmes/strategies
- Promote partnerships
- Encourage programmatic response by NGOs and IGOS
- List activities that Parties may wish to implement





New Delhi work programme Funding

- No special mechanism
- But existing funding opportunities by the GEF, and by other multilateral and bilateral sources
- → Elaborate on Article 6 activities in the context of
 CB activities
- \rightarrow Identify and engage existing regional resources



New Delhi work programme Review process

- Basis for evaluation :
 - Reports in national communications
 - Regional workshops
 - Other sources



Towards an enhanced work programme Milestones

- May 2007 SBI 26
 - Agree on an enhanced work programme (WP)
- July 2007 SIDS workshop
- August 2007 Views from Parties
- December 2007 SBI 27 / COP13
 - Adopt enhanced work programme
 - Synthesis report to form the basis of the draft WP





Towards an enhanced WP Key elements

- Build on NDWP
- Defined time frame & milestones
- Foster national efforts & strengthen regional and subregional efforts
- Articulate objectives, roles & responsibilities
- Provide additional focus on mentoring & exchange of material
- Facilitate provision of technical & financial support

- Define specific needs of the SIDS
- Identify gaps, opportunities & priorities
- Outline elements of an enhanced WP
