Climate Change Learning

- Climate change creates unprecedented challenges for learning and capacity development
- Diverse sectors of government (e.g. agriculture, finance, transport, finance, etc)
- Different levels of governance (e.g. national, sub-national, local)
- Multitude of concerned groups (e.g. private sector, research entities, civil society groups, etc)
- Complex issues (e.g. modeling, population dynamics, desease patterns, justice, etc.)

The Origin of CC:Learn....

- UN side events in Poznan (2008) revealed commitment of UN to scale up climate change learning and capacity development activities
- Information on relevant initiatives and activities available, but often scattered
- Opportunities emerged to enhance information exchange and experience sharing on UN-supported climate change learning and skills development
- CC:Learn concept developed through collaboration of UNDP, UNEP, UNITAR, UNFCCC and UNFPA within CEB framework in 2009
- Important to take perspectives of clients in developing countries into account

UNFPA Releases Resource Kit "Climate Change Connections: Gender and Population"



How can population and gender aspects be integrated into policy analysis and decision-making related to climate change? The resource kit Climate Change Connections: Gender and Population - developed by United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and the Women's Environment and Development Organization (WEDO) - is designed to build capacity and provide tools and strategies for analysis and action on climate

change. It is innovative in the way it integrates gender analysis and population dynamics to increase understanding of complex issues and underlying constraints prevalent that thread throughout the climate change debate. The resource kit supports policy makers, governments and activists to more clearly understand relevant linkages.

Climate change threatens to set back development efforts by decades, profoundly affecting all of us. But the impact won't be felt equally. Those with the fewest resources will be most susceptible to its negative effects — particularly women, the majority of the world's poor. In many parts of the world, gender inequalities still hinder women's equal access to decision-making, formal financial systems, land ownership, reproductive health care, education and information, undermining their well-being in addition to that of their families and communities.

At the same time, women's vulnerability can obscure the fact that they are an untapped resource in efforts to cope with the effects of climate change and reduce the emissions that cause it. As innovators, organizers, leaders, educators and caregivers, women are uniquely positioned to help curb the harmful consequences of a changing climate. Incorporating a gender perspective into climate change policies, projects and funds is crucial in ensuring that women contribute to and benefit from equitable climate solutions.







Programme Area 2: Strengthening Human Resources, Learning and Skills on Climate Change

- Knowledge and skills fundamental to achieving climate change objectives at the national, sub-national and local level
- Often not systematically considered in projects, sectoral strategies, etc.
- Opportunity to foster a strategic approach to strengthen human resources, learning and skills on climate change at the country level
- Goal is to work with partner countries to systematically integrate learning and skills development within institutions, programmes and projects
- Country-driven strategy may become framework to guide external support (by UNCTs, bi-laterals, etc)
- Guidance methodology under preparation through UN CC:Learn

Human Resource, Learning and Skills Development Strategy on Climate Change:

Scope and Methodology

- Focus on professional and vocational learning
- Country strategies would identify learning action within priority sectors (e.g. agriculture, transport, education, health, etc)
- Consideration of various levels of governance (i.e. national, subnational, and local)
- Need to distinguish between awareness, knowledge, skills, attitude and on-the-job performance
- Building upon and strengthening existing human resource strategies
- Involvement and ownership of national learning and vocational institutions of key importance

Country Pilot Projects: Next Steps

- Comments, contributions and input on project concept and methodology welcome
- Dialogue with interested countries ongoing
- Initiation of 3-4 pilot projects at the end of 2010, resources permitting (fund-raising initiated)
- Linkage with 2nd Comprehensive Review of the UNFCCC Capacity Development Framework in 2010
