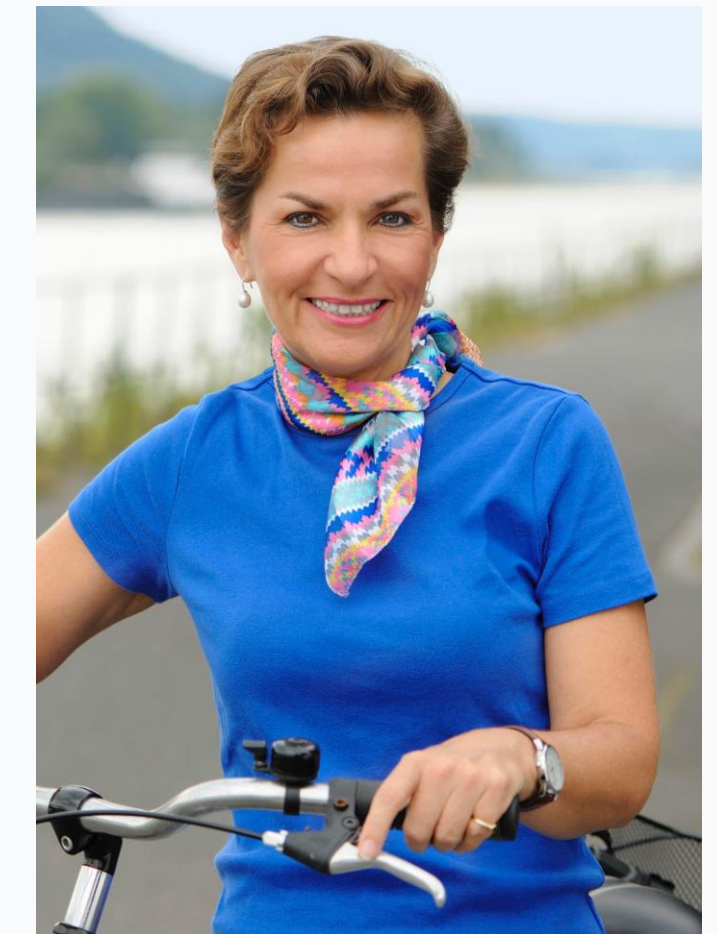

Integrate Article 6 activities into existing climate change programmes and strategies

03

Prepare a national strategy on Article 6

04

Develop communication strategies on climate change

05

Foster the participation of all stakeholders in the implementation of Article 6

06

Prepare an Article 6 chapter in the national communications

INTERMEDIATE REVIEW

Findings

- Progress has been made by Parties and other relevant stakeholders in planning, coordinating and implementing the six elements of Article 6
- Although all Parties reported that they are currently implementing ACE activities, those are not always embedded in their broader mitigation and adaptation actions
- Some Parties reported that they developed a national strategy on Article 6 in a multisectoral, multi-stakeholder and participatory process
- Parties have increasingly reported on elements covered by Article 6 in their national communications
- 134 Parties mentioned at least one of the six elements covered by Article 6 in their INDCs

The solutions to climate change are also the paths to a safer, healthier, cleaner and more prosperous future for all. To see this and to understand what needs to be done requires a sharp and sustained focus on education, training and public awareness in all countries and at all levels of government, society and enterprise.

That is why governments have agreed to educate, empower and engage all stakeholders and major groups. This common objective is anchored in [Article 6](#) of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change, and in [Article 10 \(e\)](#) of the Kyoto Protocol.

To achieve their goal, governments are working with the private sector and civil society stakeholders in six priority action areas: education, training, public access to information, public awareness, public participation and international cooperation.

All stakeholders have agreed that the scale of the challenge posed by climate change requires these activities to be stepped up and that they should not only be collaborative but also country-driven, interdisciplinary and respect the culture of each participating country and group. [More>>](#)

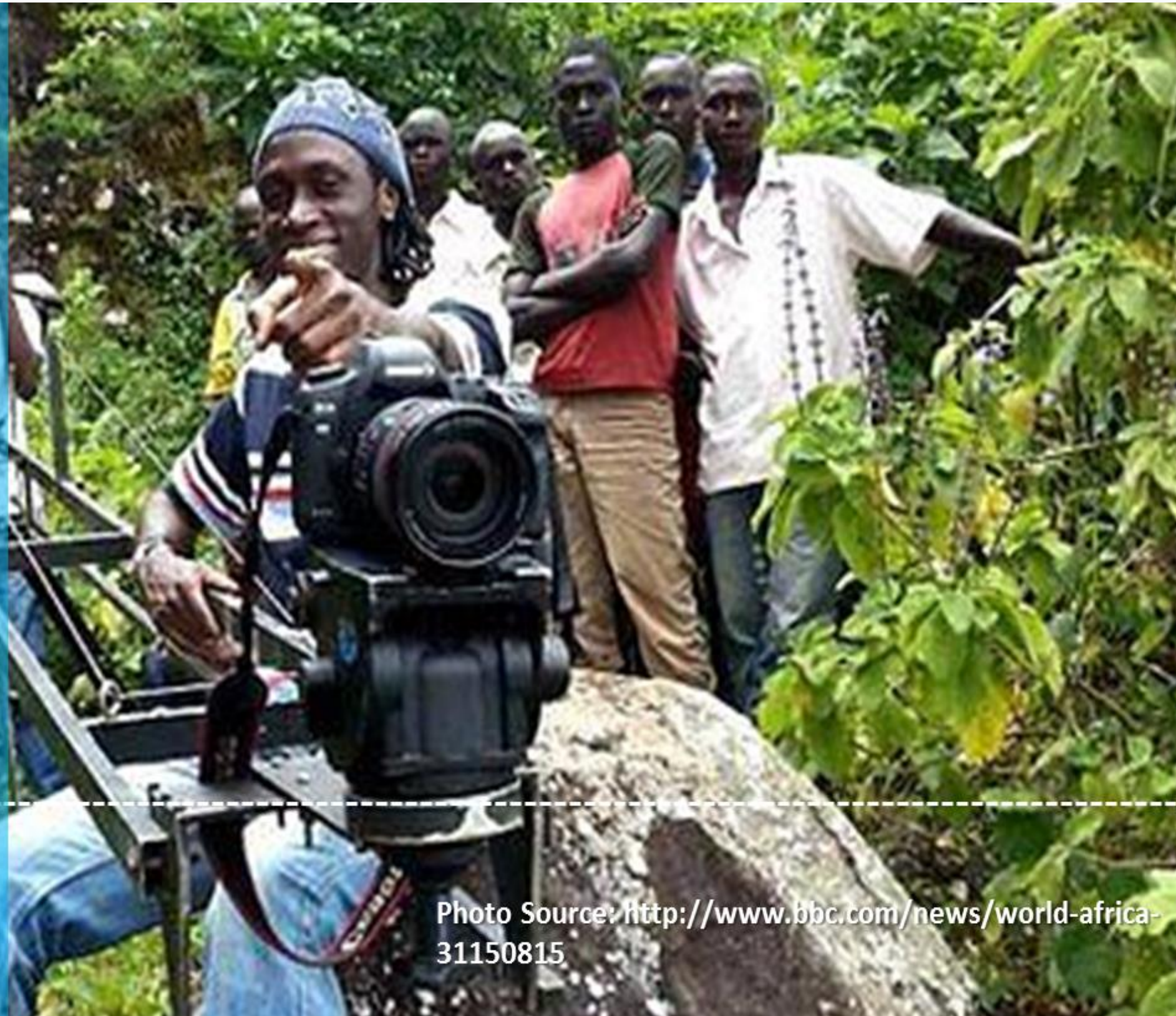

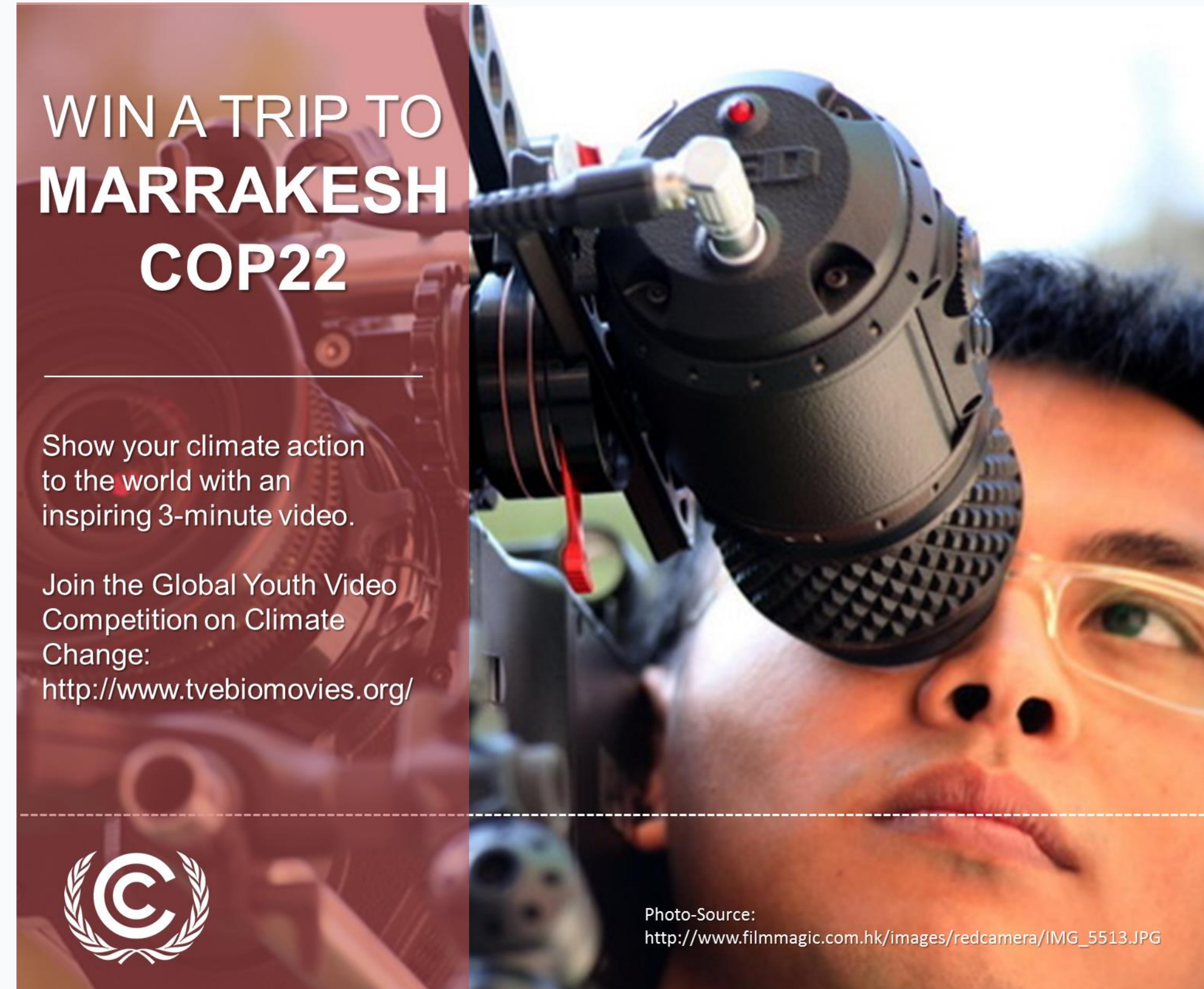

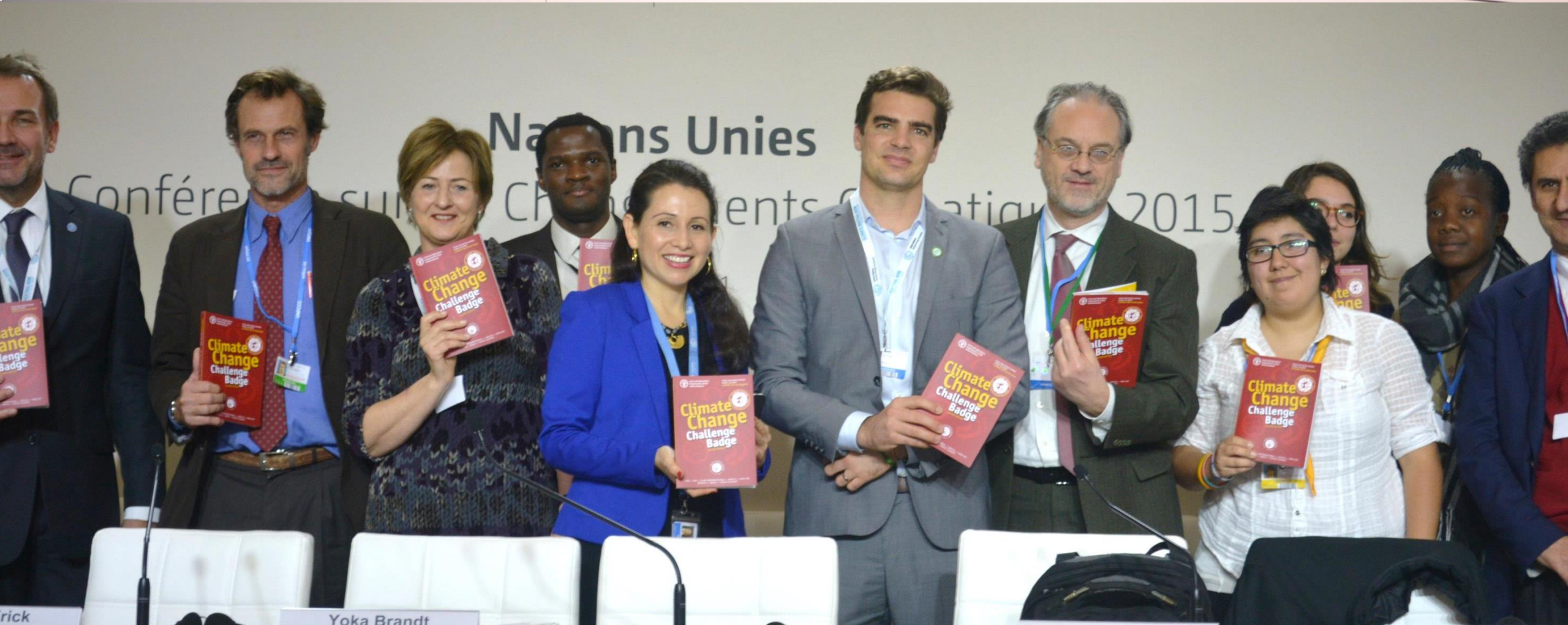

SBI 44 adopted the SBI Chair conclusions and forwarded a Decision to be adopted at COP 22/CMP 12 in Morocco



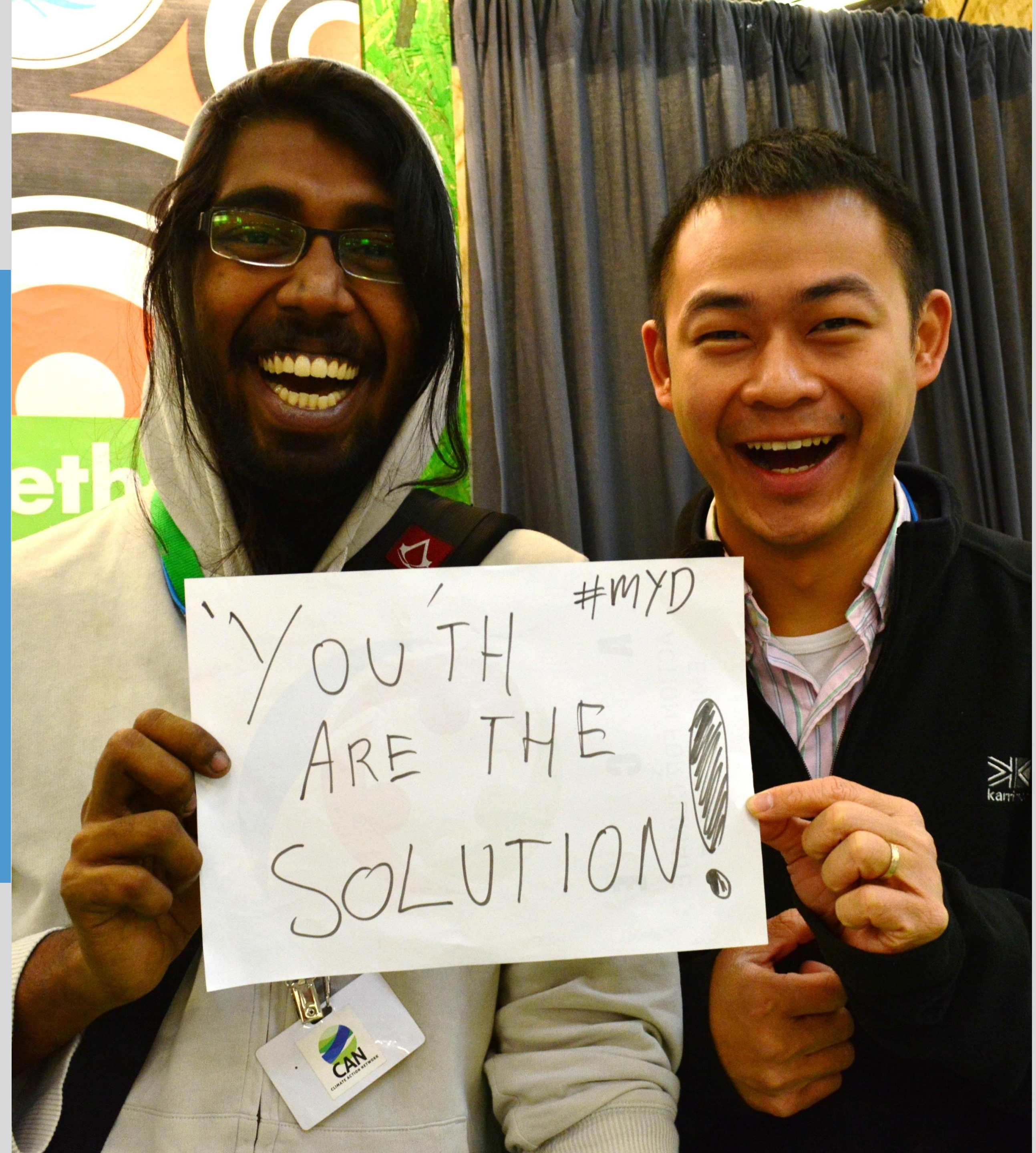
INTERMEDIATE REVIEW

Recommendations

- Strengthening international cooperation to scale up action
- Strengthen the existing skills and capacity of the national focal points for Article 6
- Establishing partnerships with relevant stakeholders at all levels
- Promoting public participation in decision-making processes
- Fostering ways of improving cooperation and cross-sectoral coordination among ministries
- Empowering youth and other stakeholders to enhance the implementation of climate action
