

What is a COY?



Local COYs (LCOY)

- 8 LCOYs in 2015
- 24 LCOYs in 2016
- At: Benin, Brazil, Morocco, Japar Madagascar, Canada, India, New Caledonia and other places

12 years since inception:

- More than 25 000 youth engaged
- □ Representing 125+ nationalities
- ☐ At 12 Global COYs, and 30+ Local COYs



COY as an ACE event itself!

Free and non-accreditation event for international youth:

- Raising awareness for hundreds to thousands of young people
- Policy Training/Capacity-building
- Network Building: Sharing and building connections between various youth initiatives





COY as an opportunity for national networks to structure

- Structuring local networks:
 Cooperation between different local grassroot initiatives
- Emergence of national initiatives (Warsaw, COY 2013)
- Train on organizational skills



COY as a preparation for COP

- Structuring the YOUNGO
 Working Groups
- Empowering on negotiations and technical points
- Enabling to be more effective during COP





COY as an opportunity to exchange practices

 NGOs, students and young professionals: exchanges on best practices

 Global COY: enhancing participation (what about Global South?)

 Local COYs: Focusing on national/regional issues with local contexts adapted solutions, and networking.
