Thirteenth meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance Bonn, Germany, 18–20 July 2016

Background paper on the draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism

Expected actions by the Standing Committee on Finance

The Standing Committee on Finance (SCF) will be invited to:

- Discuss and agree on ways to undertake further work and provide recommendations to COP 22 on the following two issues by considering the outcomes of inter-sessional work undertaken by the co-facilitators:
 - Draft set of core guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism;
 - Frequency of guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism;
- Initiate preparation of draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism in 2016.

I. Options for consideration by the Standing Committee on Finance

Draft set of core guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism

- 1. The SCF may wish to consider the compilation and analysis of previous guidance provided to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism¹ (hereinafter referred as the C&A) which has been updated with latest guidance from the Conference of the Parties (COP) at its twenty-first session and reorganized by: (a) thematic areas² and operational guidance³ and; (b) order of relevance from ongoing to obsolete guidance.
- 2. The tables of compilation and analysis of previous guidance provided to the Global Environment Facility (GEF) and the Green Climate Fund (GCF) can be accessed at: <u>http://www.unfccc.int/6881</u>.⁴ The tables contained in annex I and II contain the outline of the updated the C&A.
- 3. The SCF may wish to consider undertaking further work to prepare its recommendation on core guidance, with a view to further enhancing the utility of the C&A of previous guidance to, *inter alia*, other thematic bodies engaged in providing guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism. Specifically, the SCF could:
 - a. Invite the thematic bodies to:
 - i. Consider existing respective thematic and operational guidance contained in the C&A in deliberating on the need and nature of further guidance i.e. the Technology Executive Committee could consider the technology tables in the updated C&A, with a view to increasing coherence and reducing repetitiveness of future guidance;
 - ii. Provide their inputs and feedback on the C&A based on their experience this year, including on the completeness for each respective thematic area, with the aim of increased transparency and coordination;
 - b. Invite its members and observers, including the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, to also provide inputs and feedback on the completeness of the C&A of previous guidance.

- 4. Once the inputs are received by the SCF, the updated C&A can be revised and circulated inter-sessionally and uploaded on the SCF website prior to COP 22.
- 5. Furthermore, the SCF may wish to consider what it will report to COP 22 on the issue of draft core guidance. Options include:
 - a. Reporting on the progress that the SCF made in 2016, including its work on the C&A and outreach to other thematic bodies;
 - b. Making the updated C&A available on the SCF website as a tool for Parties, the thematic bodies and any other interested stakeholders;
 - c. Indicating that the SCF will annually update the information referred above for information by the COP and its further deliberation on the issue of draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism;
 - d. Indicating that the SCF will continue to prepare the draft set of core guidance based on this approach, with a view to preparing its recommendations by COP 23.
- 6. The SCF may wish to agree on the timeline for conducting the work suggested above. An indicative timeline is contained in annex III. The timeline identifies inter-sessional work after SCF 13 and proposes that the SCF resume its preparation of draft core guidance and identification of frequency of guidance at SCF 15 in 2017.

Frequency of guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism

7. The SCF may wish to continue its work on the frequency of guidance in coordination with its recommendations on the draft set of core guidance. The SCF could indicate to the CP22 that frequency of guidance will be further discussed by the SCF, once the draft set of core guidance is extracted from the compilation and analysis table, in the context of reviewing and updating the draft set of core guidance at a frequency recommended by the SCF.

Initiate preparation of draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism

- 8. The SCF may wish to initiate the preparation of draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, which, as per its agreement during its twelfth meeting, is to be in the form of a draft decision and of strategic nature.⁵ Possible approaches during this meeting could include:
 - a. Inviting the co-facilitators to brief the SCF on their participation to the meetings of the thematic bodies during the inter-sessional period;
 - b. Considering the draft report of the GCF that is currently available;⁶
 - c. Continuing to elaborate on the elements that could form the basis of developing guidance of a more strategic nature;⁷
 - d. Agreeing on the next steps, including:
 - i. Setting a deadline for inputs from the SCF members for textual inputs for a draft decision;
 - ii. Mandating the co-facilitators to prepare a compilation of inputs received from the SCF members, the AC and the TEC with a view to initiate the drafting during SCF 14.

II. Background

Draft set of core guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism

- 9. At SCF 12, the SCF agreed that the co-facilitators would work inter-sessionally on this issue and provide recommendations to SCF 13. It was also agreed that the elements that could form the core guidance could be extracted from the C&A, but that some further work was required beforehand.⁸
- 10. During the inter-sessional period, the co-facilitators updated the C&A that was presented at SCF 11 by: (a) adding the latest guidance from COP 21; (b) reorganizing guidance by a number of thematic areas and by operational guidance on a more general nature and; (c) reorganized in the order of relevance from ongoing to obsolete. Any piece of guidance that pertains to more than one thematic area was put into multiple relevant tables, to ensure the comprehensiveness of this exercise. This was done with a view to increase its user-friendliness, its usefulness to other thematic bodies and to undertake further analysis to highlight guidance that could constitute core guidance. The C&A tables can be accessed at http://www.unfccc.int/6881 and the tables contained in annex I and II contain the outline of how the compilation and analysis of previous guidance provided to the GEF and the GCF has been reorganized.
- 11. The updated C&A may be useful, in particular for the thematic bodies, in distinguishing ongoing guidance from the guidance that might be retiring. For example, the table of ongoing guidance related to adaptation, together with any related operational guidance, could be useful for the Adaptation Committee in deliberating on the need for and nature of further guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism on adaptation.
- 12. In order to ensure comprehensiveness and robustness of this exercise of reorganizing the C&A of all guidance provided to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism from COP 1 until COP 21, the co-facilitators recommend that the SCF calls for inputs and feedback from its members, observers including the GEF and the GCF and other thematic bodies to check the completeness for each respective thematic area. This will also ensure an inclusive and transparent process of work, given that many stakeholders, including Parties and observers, will benefit from a streamlined C&A of previous guidance provided to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism.
- 13. For example, the thematic bodies could be invited to provide their feedback on the C&A, based on their experience of utilizing the C&A in preparing their inputs to the draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism in 2016. The feedback will be useful in improving the C&A further and enhancing collaboration between the thematic bodies on the work related to draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism.
- 14. Based on inputs referred to in paragraphs 12 and 13 above, the C&A can be further revised and circulated inter-sessionally to the SCF for agreement. The revised C&A could be uploaded to the SCF website and included, through a web-link, in its annual report to COP 22. The SCF could resume its work of identifying/extracting draft set of core guidance from the updated C&A at SCF 15 in 2017, with a view to finalizing this work by COP 23. An indicative timeline is attached to this note as annex III.

Frequency of guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism

15. At its twelfth meeting, the SCF was encouraged to reflect upon the timeline and the pros and cons of different frequencies of guidance, as contained in the background note from SCF 11.⁹ The SCF recalled the importance of timing of the COP guidance as input into the replenishment processes and agreed that the co-facilitators will work inter-sessionally on this issue with an aim to continuing the discussion at SCF 13.

Preparation of draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism

- 16. At its twelfth meeting, the SCF agreed to adopt and enhance the approach used last year in preparing draft guidance to the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, by collaborating with and reaching out to other thematic bodies of the Convention. In addition, the SCF also agreed to be more ambitious this year in developing guidance of a more strategic nature and considered elements that could form the basis of such guidance.¹⁰
- 17. During the inter-sessional period, as agreed, an official communication was sent to the AC and the TEC inviting those bodies to provide inputs on the issue of draft guidance. In addition, the co-facilitators attended the following meetings to brief and clarify issues around the inputs to be provided by the thematic bodies.
 - a. Twelfth meeting of the Technology Executive Committee;¹¹
 - b. Seventh meeting of the Advisory Board of the Climate Technology Centre and Network;¹²
 - c. In-session workshop on linkages between the Technology Mechanism and the Financial Mechanism of the Convention.¹³
