Background

2-year initial workplan – Action Area 7:

Diffusion of information related to financial instruments and tools that address the risks of loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change to facilitate finance in loss and damage situations

- Invite the SCF, in its next biennial assessment and overview of climate finance flows, to include information on financial instruments that address the risks of loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change
- An invitation to the SCF to dedicate its 2016 Forum to financial instruments that address the risks of loss and damage



Purpose of the Forum

- To contribute to develop recommendations on:
 - how loss and damage affects particularly vulnerable developing countries, vulnerable populations and the ecosystems that they depend on;
 - how approaches to address loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change can be designed and implemented;
- To take stock of existing financial instruments
- To share information & experiences and promote better understanding & awareness
- To identify potential climate finance flows, instruments and tools to inform the next biennial assessment
- Categorize instruments and identify typologies for various aspects of LnD (types of risks) to be addressed
- To identify gaps
- To discuss concepts for designing insurance premium levels
- To build networks, partnerships for outreach
- To provide inputs to establishing a clearinghouse for risk transfer



Scope and relevant information/case studies

- To provide inputs on how to analyse and structure risks
- To design financing appropriate approaches
- To include experiences, lessons learnt and solutions, e.g. from:
 - ➤ Regional Sovereign Risk Pools (PCRAFI, CCRIF, ARC)
 - InsuResilience the G7 climate risk insurance initiative
 - Private sector
 - > National and subnational risk transfer facilities
 - Micro-insurance programs
