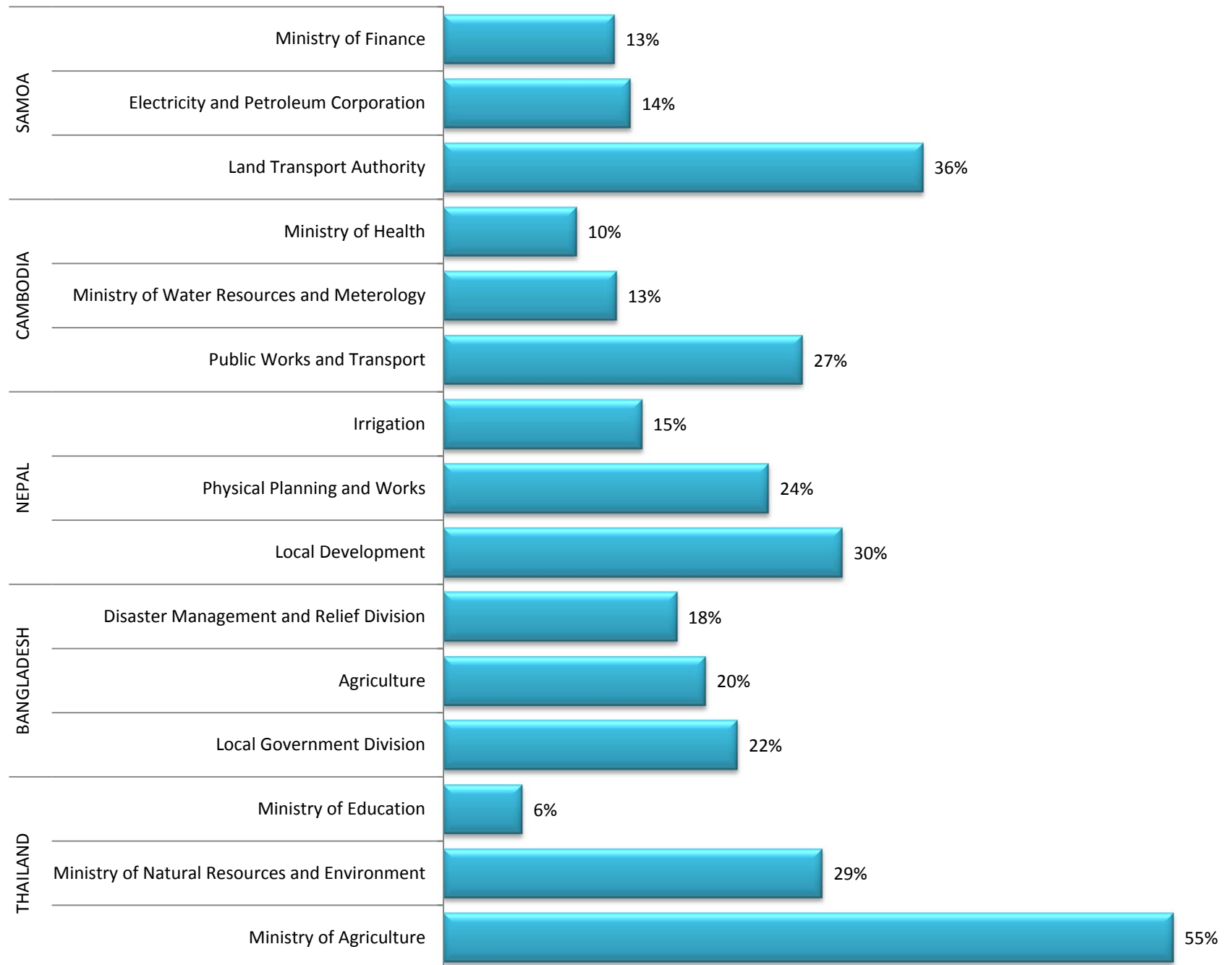
# **Climate Public Expenditure and Institutional Reviews (CPEIRs)**

# Asia Pacific: a map of climate expenditures

<b>Nepal</b>	6.7 %	239m	10 ministries reviewed. Not include 'off-budget' donor support
<b>Bangladesh</b>	5.5 % 7.2 % (2010/11)	1 billion	37 ministries reviewed. Climate Fiscal Framework revised includes off budget donor support.
<b>Thailand</b>	2.7 %	1.7 billion	14 ministries reviewed. Not include 'off-budget' donor support
<b>Cambodia</b>	Approx. 5%	185m	All Government programmes reviewed and includes 'off-budget' donor support. CCFF revised.
<b>Samoa</b>	15 %	316m	All Government programmes reviewed and includes 'off-budget' donor support

# Impact of CC on Benefits

- Actions already producing reasonable BCRs
- Benefits increased by CC (eg because the action provides protection against temp/floods/drought and this protection becomes more important)
- These actions should get a marginally higher priority
- The CC weight is the % increase in benefits
