<u>UNFCCC side event COP 19</u> <u>Fast-start Finance - lessons learned from 2010 to 2012</u>

Background

The overall aim of the information event is to offer developed country Parties the opportunity to present information on their final fast-start finance (FSF), as well as for Parties to engage in indepth discussions on important lessons learned during the FSF period. This event is especially significant in light of the overall climate finance discussions that will take place in Warsaw, including the high-level ministerial dialogue where progress on efforts being undertaken by developed country Parties to scale up climate finance after 2012 will be considered.

- What are the overall lessons learned from FSF in mobilizing climate finance resources?
- How are these lessons being harnessed to support the progress in the mobilization of climate finance in general and the scaled up mobilization of climate action after 2012 in particular?
