Workshop on the New Market-Based Mechanism

Tuesday 8 October World Conference Center Bonn Platz der Vereinten Nationen 2, 53113 Bonn

I. Date

1. The workshop will take place on Tuesday 8 October 2013 from 9:00 - 18:15.

II. Mandate and background

- 2. The Conference of Parties (COP) at its eighteenth session in Doha, Qatar, requested the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) to conduct a work programme to elaborate modalities and procedures for the mechanism defined in decision 2/CP.17, paragraph 83, with the view to recommending a draft decision to COP 19 for adoption. COP 18 also agreed on a number of elements that can be considered as part of the work programme.
- 3. Following the mandate by COP 18, SBSTA 38¹ requested the secretariat to organize a workshop to discuss the modalities and procedures for the new market-based mechanism (NMM) on the basis of a number of questions on its role and technical design in relation to the elements of the work programme. Parties and admitted UNFCCC observer organizations were invited to submit their views on these matters by 2 September 2013. The secretariat was requested to prepare a technical synthesis of relevant materials, including the submissions mentioned above and to make it available for the workshop and for consideration at SBSTA 39.

III. Proposed approach

4. The objective of the workshop is to provide an opportunity for discussion and interaction between Parties, experts and admitted observer organisations with the view to clarify and narrow down the options for the role and technical design of the NMM in order to facilitate focussed discussions at SBSTA 39 and possible decision-making at COP 19.

Framework Convention on Climate Change

- The technical synthesis provided as background information for this workshop contains a summary of the submissions by Parties and other relevant materials. It attempts to identify possible areas of convergence, areas for further discussion and options for decision-making. The submissions by Parties and admitted observer organizations are made available on the UNFCCC website for further reference.2
- After the opening of the workshop by the co-facilitators and an introduction of the submissions and the technical synthesis prepared by the secretariat, the discussions will be clustered in six sessions, organized around thematic areas related to the elements of the work programme. A limited number of presentations are planned for each session in order to facilitate the discussions. After the presentations, the co-facilitators will pose the relevant questions on the role and technical design of the NMM which were proposed at SBSTA 38, and open the floor to all participants. Participants are invited to come prepared to focus their discussions around the questions for each session, as specified in Section IV.
- At the end of the workshop, the co-facilitators will invite participants to exchange views on options for the way forward in Warsaw and will wrap up the discussions. The informal summary of the co-facilitators will be made available on the UNFCCC website. A written report will be prepared by the secretariat and will be made available for consideration at SBSTA 39.


