Working together to close the gap: Views of the LDC group

Key elements of the LDC Group submissions on options for raising mitigation ambition

- Addressing the ambition gap and ensuring the level of ambition is increased needs to be addressed to safeguard the most vulnerable countries and avoid any further increase in adaptation needs.
- The Durban decision clearly acknowledges with "grave concern" the significant ambition gap between the 2020 pledges and the aggregate emission pathways.
- Aggregate level of ambition must be based on scientific and technical analysis of emission pathways consistent with holding warming below 2°C and to limiting warming to 1.5°C, and the LDCs believe that achieving the level of ambition to stabilize the temperature below 2°C or 1.5°C is still possible.

- Decision 1/CP17 clearly has a dual mandate: Process to negotiate a new legal agreement applicable to all and launching a workplan to address the ambition gap.
- As the ADP work on mitigation clearly will look at ambition and commitments beyond 2020, the workplan on enhancing mitigation ambition should focus on pre-2020 action.
- Therefore, the workplan will explore options to close the ambition gap represented by the 2020 pledges and to ensure the highest possible mitigation efforts by all Parties.
- LDCs call on all Parties to show the political commitment and willingness to explore a range of options to increase the level of ambition and the Annex I Parties to show the leadership.

Short term activities to be included in the workplan

- The workplan on enhancing mitigation ambition must identify a series of short term activities in 2012.
- These activities could include:
 - a series of in-session workshops;
 - ministerial conferences and meetings to ensure high-level engagement for enhancing mitigation ambition;
 - submissions and discussions that lead to the adoption of more ambitious economy wide emission reduction targets by developed countries including legally binding QELROs for Annex I Kyoto Protocol Parties and comparable commitments for Annex I non-Kyoto Protocol Parties.
- The workplan should encourage more ambitious NAMAs by developing countries along with mechanisms for ensuring the appropriate scale of financial resources, technology transfer and capacity building support.

Short term activities to be included in the workplan...cont'd

- Call upon the Annex I Parties to:
 - Remove the conditionalities around their pledges;
 - Convert their pledges into commitments;
 - Set renewable energy targets and comply to them;
 - Non-Kyoto Parties adopt unconditional, legally-binding, economy-wide emission reduction commitments and comparable commitments.
- Kyoto Protocol:
 - Avoid a gap between the commitment periods;
 - Remove loopholes and strengthen accounting rule;
 - including eliminating the effect of surplus assigned amount units (AAUs.)
 - Conclude QELROs for Annex I Kyoto Protocol Parties;
 - Ensure the continuity of the Kyoto Protocol's flexible mechanisms with the view to help Annex I parties comply with their obligations;
 - Eligibility to these mechanisms should be exclusive to Parties that are part of the second commitment period of the Kyoto Protocol.

Short term activities to be included in the workplan...cont'd

- Encourage development and implementation of Low Emission Development Strategies (LEDS) in all countries;
- Engage all developing Parties in concerted, global emissions reduction efforts;
- Ensure effective, new, additional financial support as well as technological and capacity building to design and implement NAMAs in developing countries.
- Ensure new markets mechanisms are well defined:
 - Ensure environmental integrity;
 - No double counting;
 - Robust international units, which can be verified.

- Outputs of this workshop, technical activities and submissions should feed into the ADP discussions and next steps.
- The ADP ambition process will make recommendations to COP18 and subsequent COPs with a view to adopting decisions that contribute to enhancing understanding of the global ambition gap, encourage enhancing and implementing pledges, and taking steps to promote supplementary initiatives to close the gap.
