Develop a new UNFCCC mechanism to ensure a liquid global carbon market.

- Support Fossil Fuel Subsidy Reform
- Total global subsidies of \$400-600bn p.a.
 (depending on fuel prices).
- Potential to reduce global CO_2 emissions by 10% by 2050.
