Introduction

- Ghana's future economic transformation agenda is anchored in green growth.
- Charting low-emission development pathway is strategically important to Ghana as enshrined in National Climate Policy
- Presents opportunity to attract green investments and climate friendly technologies.
- Scaling mitigation actions is important through international partnerships and mobilizing private capital.

 Ghana is looking forward to the ambitious "global climate agreement" to build strategic development partnerships

Ghana

- GDP/capita of ~ 1,652US Dollars in 2011
- Major structural shift in the economy since 2006 from agriculture to servicebased.
 - Sector contribution to GDP -Services (49.3%), Industrial (27.6%) and Agriculture (23.1%) sectors.
- Climate projected to get warmer and more uncertain.
- Commercial oil production started in late 2010.
- One of the highest population growth rate (~ 2.4% per year) in the subregion.
