NOTIFICATION

United Nations Climate Change Conference 30 April–10 May 2018, Bonn, Germany

Further to the information note dated 19 January 2018 on the opening of the online registration system (ORS) for the conference, I wish to notify Parties and observer States to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and its Kyoto Protocol of the following sessions:

- Forty-eighth session of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA 48);
- Forty-eighth session of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI 48);
- Fifth part of the first session of the Ad Hoc Working Group on the Paris Agreement (APA 1.5).

The sessions will be held at the World Conference Center Bonn, Platz der Vereinten Nationen 2, 53113 Bonn, Germany (http://www.worldccbonn.com/en.html).

I would also like to inform Parties and observer States that events relating to the preparatory phase of the Talanoa Dialogue, launched by decision 1/CP.23, paragraph 10, will be organized during the sessions. They include working groups that will take place in the Langer Eugen building on the United Nations Campus on Sunday, 6 May 2018. Entrance and exit for the preparatory meetings of the least developed countries, the small island developing States and the African Group from 24 to 27 April 2018 will be through the main gate to the United Nations Campus.

Special arrangements for the meeting of the Group of 77 and China on Saturday, 28 April 2018. Upon obtaining badges at the registration desk located on the upper level of the Altes Abgeordneten Hochhaus of the United Nations Campus, participants will be required to exit these premises via the main gate. A turnstile will be enabled for exit only without an access card. Participants should then proceed to the main entrance at the World Conference Center Bonn Plenary Building for the G77 and China meeting in Chamber Hall.

As of Sunday, 29 April 2018, the registration desk will be located at the World Conference Center Bonn. Participants in the meeting of the Group of 77 and China and all the meetings of the subsidiary bodies should use the main entrance of the World Conference Center Bonn.

During the sessions of the subsidiary bodies, participants will be able to <u>exit</u> the premises via either the United Nations Campus or the World Conference Center Bonn.

Visas	All foreign delegates entering the Federal Republic of Germany must have a valid passport. Participants requiring a visa are strongly encouraged to contact the appropriate consular authorities as soon as this notification is received. The issuance of a visa for Schengen States may take up to two weeks from the date of submission of the visa application. To facilitate the issuance of a visa, a copy of the acknowledgement letter from the online registration system (ORS) must be attached to the visa application. Participants are advised that obtaining a Schengen visa is contingent on the participant securing comprehensive insurance that covers the entire stay. If you are travelling more than once, it is recommended that you obtain insurance that covers the time period of all intended stays. It is recommended to indicate in your visa application if you will attend the United Nations Climate Change Conference that will be held from 3 to 14 December 2018 in Katowice, Poland. Please indicate also if a Schengen visa has been issued to you in the last 59 months.
