Definition based on criteria:

- ❑ Be aligned with national policies, plans and strategies
- ❑ Reduces direct and indirect GHG emissions
- ❑ Contributes to sustainable development
- ❑ Has comprehensive and realistic MRV
- ❑ Promotes gender equality
- ❑ Government initiated/endorsed and facilitated

1. NAMA in Rwandan context

Definition based on criteria (...)

- ❑ Contributes to potential green transformational changes
- ❑ Is technically feasible
- ❑ Is financially viable in the long term

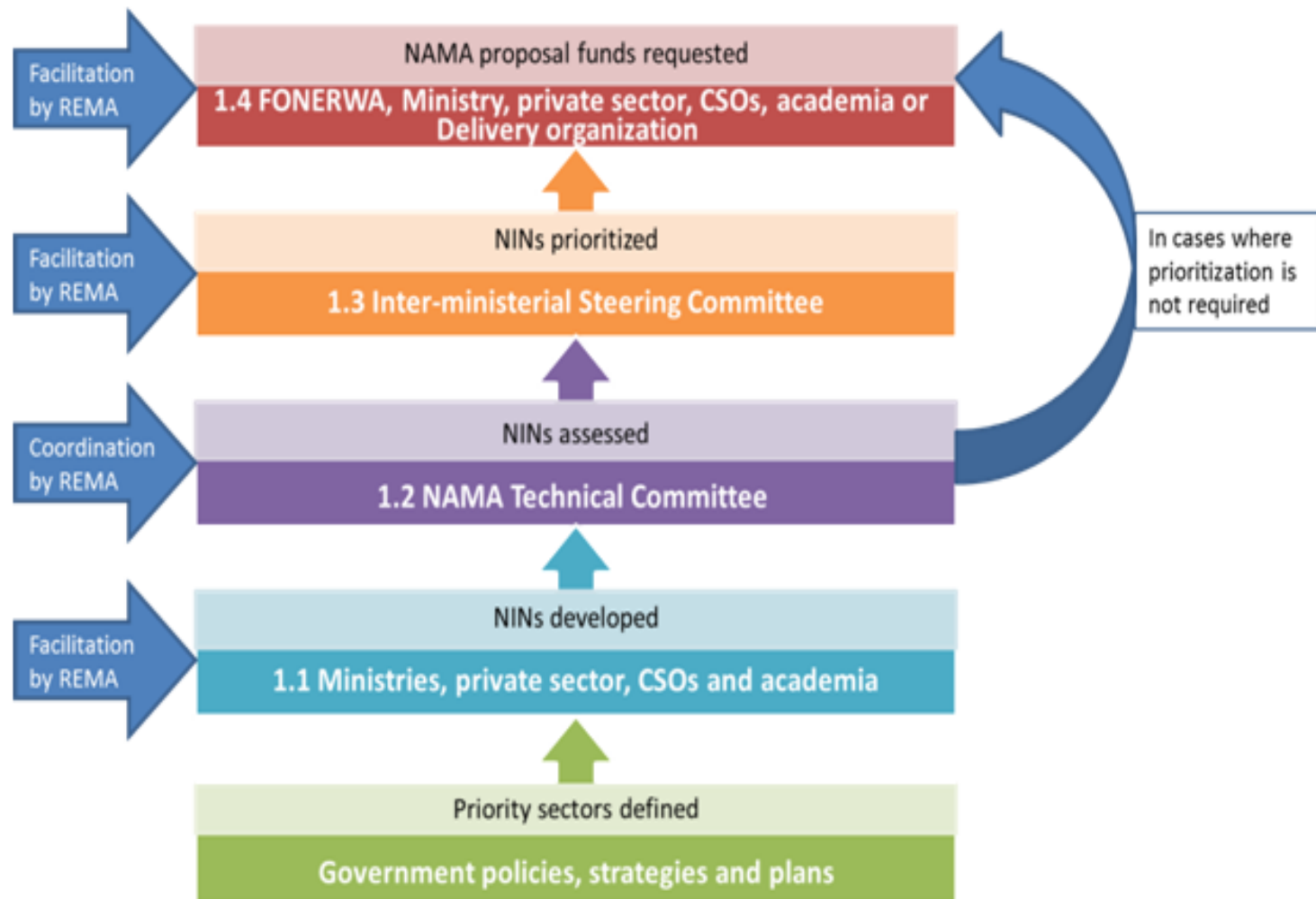


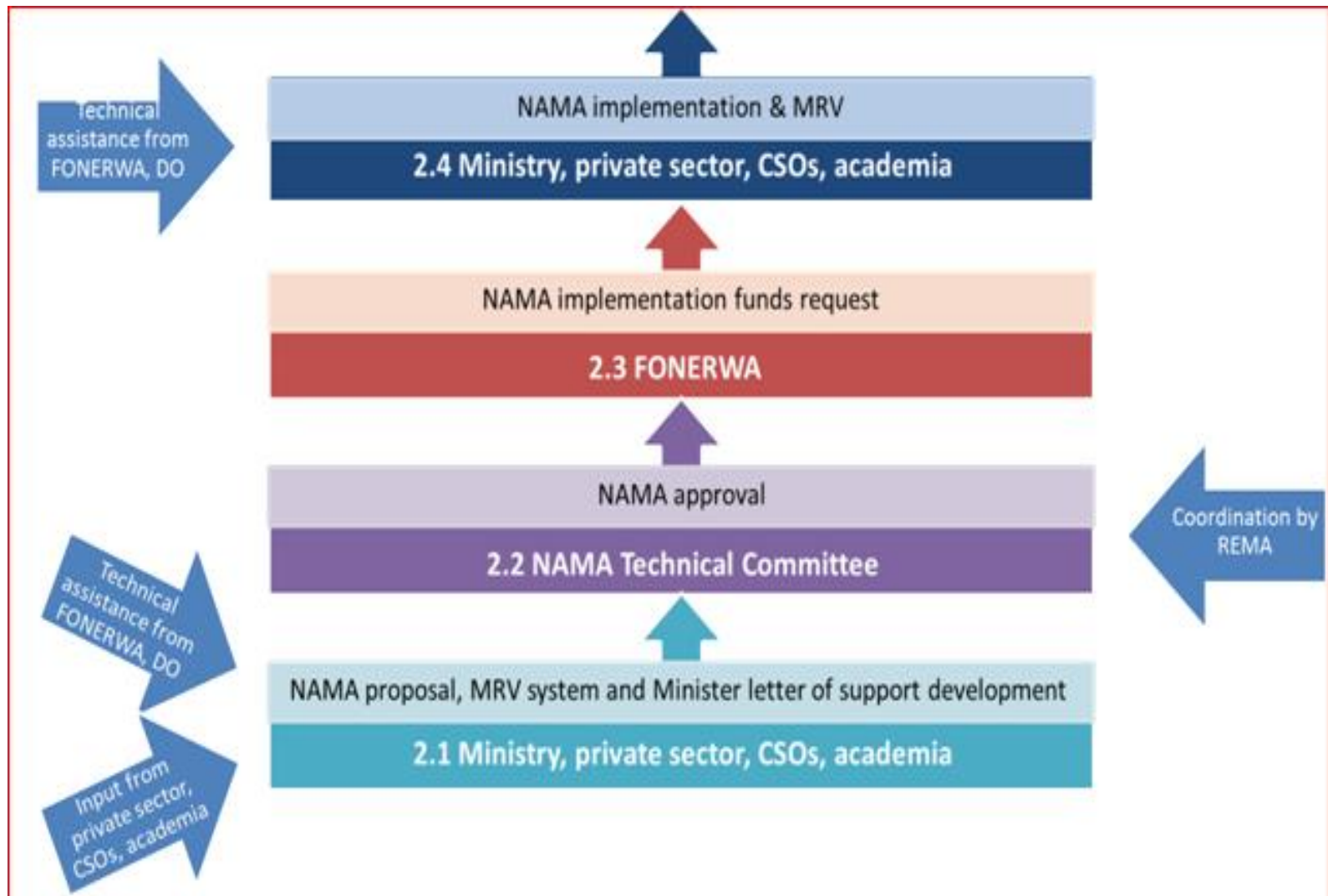
Figure 2 NAMA conceptualization process
