 - o How should NAMAs be identified and prioritised?















- Focus on the identification of best practices on financial designing of NAMAs.
- It will aim at enhancing understanding of the requirements for financing NAMAs by looking at the following questions:

 - What are the best practices in designing financial aspects of NAMAs?
 - Which characteristics make different types of NAMs attractive to finance?



Objectives

- Strengthen support for climate-resilient low emission development in all regions.
- Mobilize capacity and advance peer-to-peer learning and collaboration on climate-resilient low emission development across countries, international institutions and practitioners.
- Improve coordination of climate-resilient low emission development activities at the country, regional and global level



Approach



- Need to scale up action on LEDS through accelerated learning, knowledge exchange, and action to address urgent global challenge
 - Rapid transition to climate-resilient low emissions economies around the world
- LEDS GP Serves as Force Multiplier promoting:

Goal for 2014

- By end of 2014, at least:
 - 30 government agencies apply LEDS GP learning and technical resources to strengthen their LEDS programs in concrete ways
 - 15 international LEDS programs improve the quality of the assistance they provide as a result of their participation in the LEDS GP
 - 1000 officials and practitioners strengthen their capacity and knowledge on LEDS through LEDS GP peer exchange, training, and collaboration activities
 - 100 new officials, technical experts, and other stakeholders become engaged in LEDS development and implementation in their countries.
