# Forty-sixth session of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation 6<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Durban Forum on Capacity-building

# Concept note on the 6<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Durban Forum on Capacity-building "Enhancing Capacities for Adaptation in the context of NAPs and NDCs"

World Conference Center Bonn, Room Nairobi
Wednesday, 10 May 2017 (15:00-18:00)

## **Background**

The Durban Forum on capacity-building was established in 2011 under the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) to further enhance the monitoring and review of the effectiveness of capacity-building under the Convention. It has served as an annual, in-session discussion platform for Parties, representatives of the constituted bodies under the Convention and its Kyoto Protocol, and relevant experts and practitioners to share their experiences and exchange ideas, best practices and lessons learned on the implementation of capacity-building activities in the context of specific thematic areas.

The 4<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Durban Forum in 2015 focused on the issue of technical and financial support needed by developing countries to prepare their Intended Nationally Determined Contributions (INDCs).<sup>2</sup> The 5<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Durban Forum in 2016 focused on: (1) enhancing the capacity of developing countries to effectively implement the Paris Agreement; and (2) assessing the state of the art of capacity-building and the way forward in building capacity to support mitigation, adaptation and technology.<sup>3</sup>

COP 22 invited Parties to submit by 9 March 2017 their views on possible topics for the 6th meeting of the Durban Forum.<sup>4</sup> The topic of the 6th Durban Forum is "Enhancing capacities for adaptation in the context of National Adaptation Plans (NAPs) and Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs)". Based on the submissions received, the topic has been developed with a view to enhancing the complementarity between the Durban Forum and the work of the PCCB, which will have its first meeting from 11 to 13 May 2017. Further, the programme is designed to create synergies with the 2017–2018 in-session workshops on long-term finance, which will, inter alia, focus on enhanced access to climate finance, climate finance needs and enabling environments.

### **Scope and sub-topics**

- (a) Overarching topic: "Enhancing capacities for adaptation in the context of NAPs and NDCs"
- (b) Sub-topics:
  - 1. Enhancing human, institutional and systemic <u>capacities to design adaptation</u> interventions in the context of NAPs and NDCs
  - 2. Enhancing capacity to access finance for adaptation
  - 3. <u>Strengthening the engagement of non-Party stakeholders</u> to support capacity-building needed in the context of NAPs and NDCs.

#### **Objective**

The 6<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Durban Forum will be guided by the following objectives:

- To provide important takeaways for developing countries on how to better design and develop adaptation interventions and to increase access to finance;
- To share with support providers, the capacity-building needs and gaps identified by developing countries in designing and implementing adaptation projects and programmes in the context of NAPs and NDCs;
- To facilitate in-depth dialogue on what different Parties and non-Party stakeholders can do to enhance the capacities of developing countries to implement adaptation measures, and;
- To inform other relevant processes and meetings of the constituted bodies of the Convention, such as the 2017-2018 long-term climate finance (LTF) in-session workshops and the PCCB meetings, of the outcomes and lessons learned of the Forum.
