# Common Recommendations

- Recommendations cut across many themes, some focused on the framing/ scope of the action plan, others on possible themes
- Many related to capacity building needs at international and national levels
- Reporting mechanisms / tools and knowledge sharing for gender-responsive implementation across national planning
- Gender balance, enhanced participation of women, local communities, grassroots women
- Training for delegates

# Recommendations

- Build and/or strengthen institutional capacities on mainstreaming gender in national, regional and global climate change actions
- Capacity building for gender champions / national gender focal points
- Integrate gender in Technology Needs Assessment (TNA) and Technology Action Plans (TAPs)
- Integrate gender considerations into the existing MRV climate finance system
- Tools for gender-responsive implementation in NAPS, NAPAs, NDCs
- Enhanced capacity building on gender budgeting
- Actions should systematically integrate gender into various work programs and thematic areas and their respective bodies under the UNFCCC, rather than create a separate workstream

# Recommendations

- Ensure effective participation of local, grassroots and indigenous women
- Target resources to support the equal participation of women and men from developing countries' national delegations;
- Integrate local and traditional knowledge in the formulation of climate policy and to recognize the value of the participation of grassroots women in gender-responsive climate policy at all levels.
- Insist that there is a need to deepen the identification of "hot spots" (spatial and temporal analysis where inequality is critical) that need to be address by public policies in order to reduce current and future vulnerability to climate change

# Recommendations

- The action plan and its priority areas, activities, monitoring and review should be concrete, verifiable and achievable.
- Develop mechanisms for reporting and regular analysis of gender dimensions of Parties' actions under the transparency framework;
- Review at COP25, with submissions to report on actions in 2019
