1. Introduction to the FCPF

FCPF is a global partnership aiming at demonstrating how REDD+ can be applied at the country level

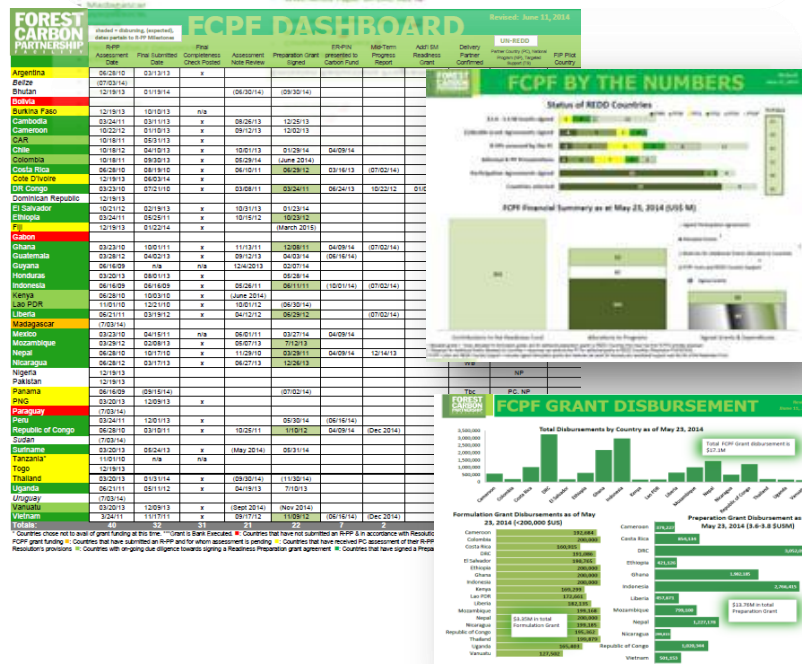
Two funds

- **The Readiness Fund:** supports 47 developing countries in preparing themselves to participate in a future, large-scale system on positive incentives for REDD+ strategies
- **The Carbon Fund:** will pilot incentive payments for REDD+ policies and measures in a limited number of countries.

2. FCFP Data Management and Reporting

- The FCPF website is a repository of documentation on countries' progress toward readiness – each country has its FCPF page
- Country Progress Reports feed FCPF Annual Report
- A dashboard tracks some milestones at the Fund level

3. Countries Expectations on Data Management and Emission Reduction Transaction Registries

- Countries often envision a Data Management System that
 - Supports the REDD+ Strategy's implementation framework;
 - Serves them to carry out key processes (approval, register, and report);
 - Assures consistency of REDD+ activities carried out at different scales;
 - Ensures transparency; and
 - Promotes equity by providing access of information to different categories of stakeholders.

4. FCPF Requirements on Data Management and Emission Reduction Transaction Registries

- Readiness Fund:
 - Readiness Assessment Framework will check if
 - *“...a national geo-referenced REDD+ information system or registry is operational, comprehensive of all relevant information and if it ensures public access to REDD+ information”*
 - *Example of relevant information:*
 - » *location*
 - » *ownership*
 - » *carbon accounting and*
 - » *financial flows for sub-national and national REDD+ programs and projects*

4. FCPF – Data Management and Emission Reduction Transaction Registries Requirements (Cont.)

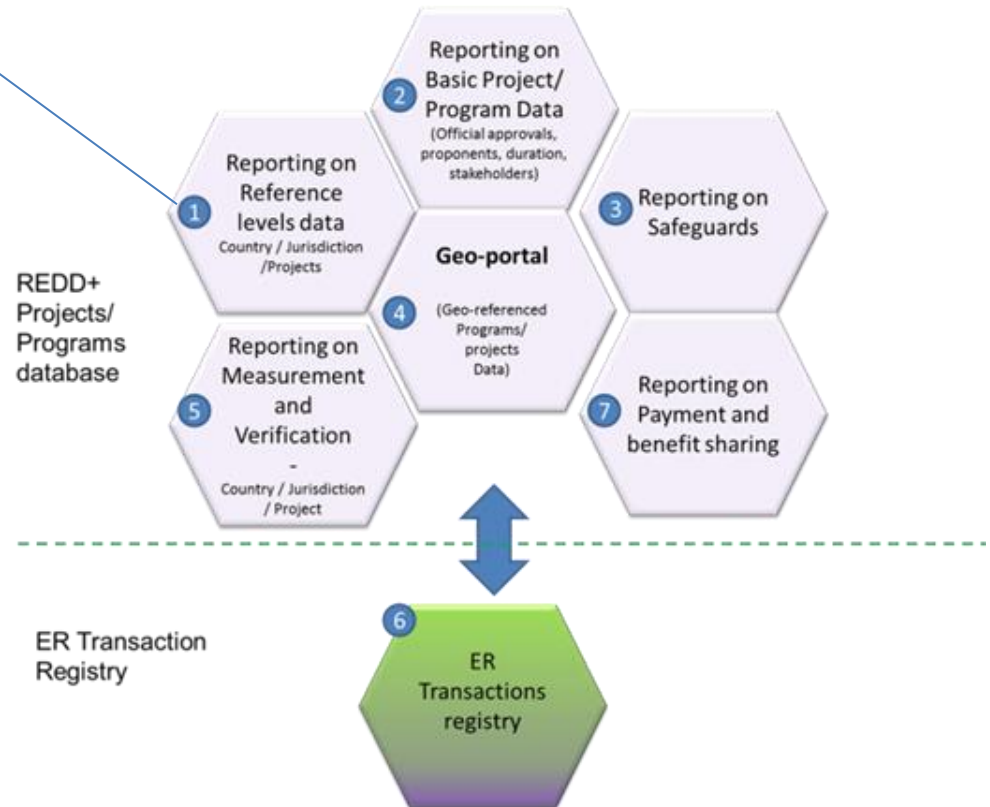
- The Carbon Fund
 - Comprehensive national or centralized REDD+ Programs and Projects Data Management System
 - To ensure appropriate ER Program documentation and transparency
 - Methodological Framework: ER Program to work with the host country to select an appropriate arrangement to avoid having multiple claims to an ER Title.
 - For example, a comprehensive national REDD+ Program and Projects Database.
 - ER transaction registry
 - to offer assurance against double counting and provide transparency to the public that there is no double claiming of the environmental benefit.
 - Methodological Framework: ER Program to work with the host country to select an appropriate arrangement to ensure that any ERs from REDD+ Activities under the ER Program are not generated more than once; and that any ERs from REDD+ Activities under the ER Program sold and transferred to the Carbon Fund are not used again by any entity.
 - Host Country either maintains its own national ER Transaction Registry, or the ER Program uses a centralized

4. Data Management System

Data Management System expected to cover main elements of REDD+ and operate in a modular format

Example of information

- ✓ List of all REL/FRL applicable at different scales
- ✓ Approval of each REL/FRL
- ✓ IPCC methods used in estimations
- ✓ Historic Reference Period
- ✓ Spatial information, maps
- ✓ Adjustments
- ✓ Etc.



- Sequencing of the different components
- Connectivity protocols not required

5. Conclusions

- Data Management Systems and Emission Reduction Transactions Registries are core elements of the FCPF.
- Countries' needs, circumstances and capacity will determine the approach to Data Management and ER Registries they could use to comply with the FCPF requirements.
- It is important to ensure harmonization between systems at different scale.
