G77 and China proposal for the LCA Enhanced Action on Adaptation

Recalling the commitments in Article 4, paragraphs 1 (e), 3 and 4 of the Convention,

Furthering recalling Decisions 1/CP.13, 1/CP.16, 2/CP.17, 5/CP.17,

Acknowledging the valuable results achieved on adaptation under the LCA including the establishment of the Cancun Adaptation Framework, the Adaptation Committee and its ongoing work

Affirming that the Cancun Adaptation Framework will promote implementation of enhanced action on adaptation in a coherent manner under the Convention, including through the work of the Adaptation Committee;

Acknowledges the work of the LEG and AC on NAPs and encourages them to continue to support both LDCs and interested developing country Parties, in accordance with their mandates;

Further acknowledging the Adaptation Committee's workplan and its ongoing work;

Stressing the need for balanced treatment and allocation of resources between adaptation and mitigation,

- 1. Requests the Adaptation Committee, in accordance with its agreed functions, to carry out the following activities:
 - a) to collaborate with the Standing Committee and other relevant institutions under the convention including the TEC to provide recommendations and guidance on ways to incentivize the implementation of adaptation actions, including finance, technology and capacity building
 - to advance conclusively in its deliberations on the establishment of an Annual Adaptation Forum to be held in conjunction with the COP, to maintain a high profile for Adaptation under the Convention, raise awareness and ambition on adaptation actions, and provide for enhanced coherence on adaptation actions
 - c) to organize an initial workshop in parallel with the 39th session of the SBs to consider progress in implementation of its workplan and to organize a workshop for this purpose every year thereafter
 - d) to undertake additional work on institutional arrangements, including national level institutional arrangements, regional centers and networks, and a possible International Center, so as to encourage cooperation and coordination between regional stakeholders and to improve the exchange of information
 - e) to promote livelihood and economic diversification to build resilience in the context of planning, prioritizing and implementing adaptation actions

- 2. Requests developed countries Parties to provide financial resources for the formulation and implementation of NAPs in LDCs and other developing country Parties, in accordance with Decision 1/CP16, paragraph 18, through the financial mechanism of the Convention;
- 3. Welcomes the establishment of the International Mechanism for loss and damage in developing countries that are particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change;
- 4. Requests developed country Parties to provide long-term, scaled-up, predictable, new and additional finance, technology and capacity-building for the operation of the international mechanism for loss and damage through the financial mechanism, including the GCF.
