# EQUITABLE ACCESS TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

TO KEEP TEMPERATURE INCREASES BELOW  
SPECIFIED LIMIT IMPLIES A GLOBAL CARBON BUDGET

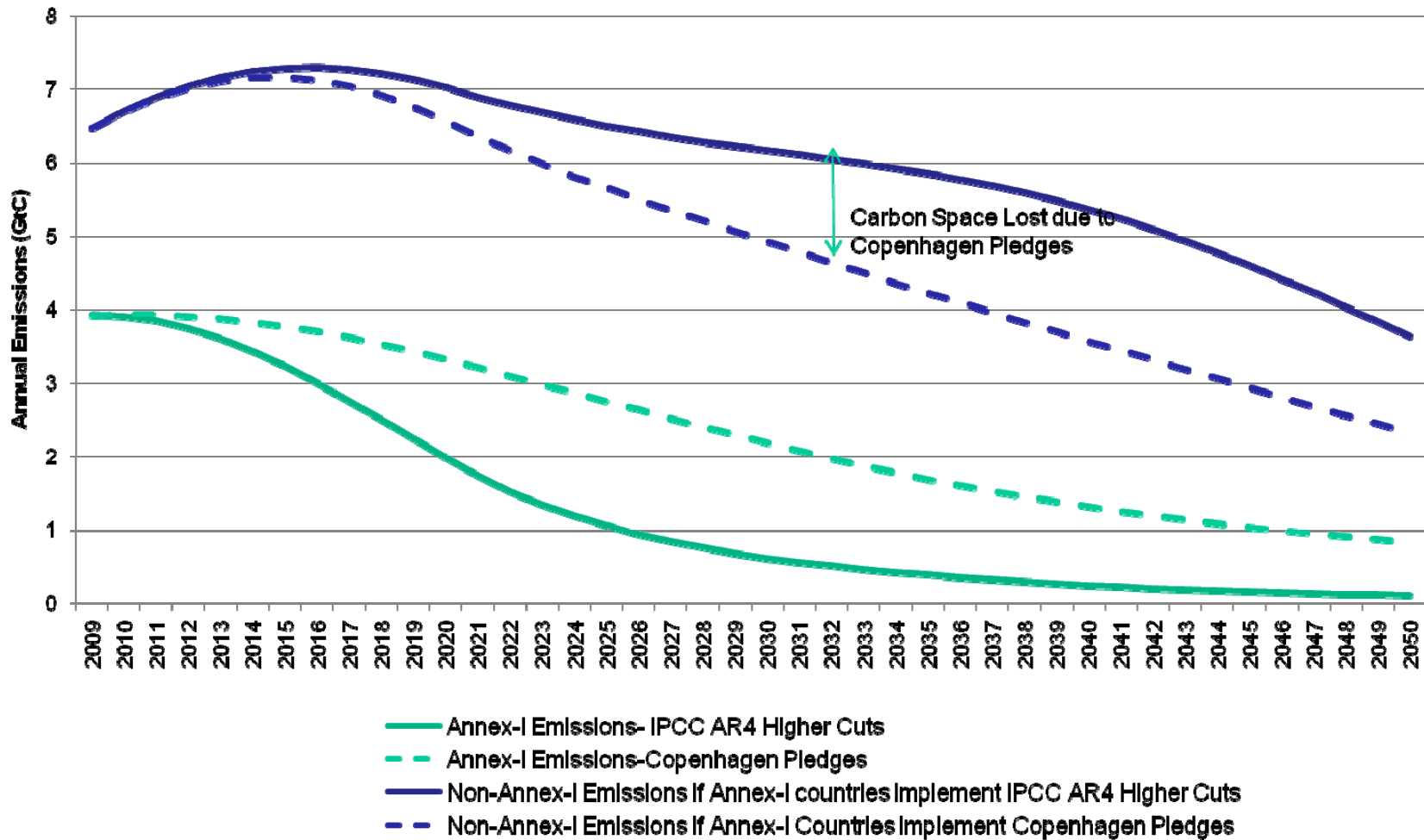
For 2010-2050 only 300 GtC allowed for the world  
(50% mean probability of staying below  
2 deg C )

IF ANNEX-I COUNTRIES DO NOT RESTRICT THEIR BUDGET  
THEN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES GET LESS

WEAK PLEDGES ARE AN APPROPRIATION OF  
DEVELOPMENT SPACE
