

**SUBMISSION BY HUNGARY AND THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION ON BEHALF
OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AND ITS MEMBER STATES**

Subject: Additional agenda items for the LCA agenda

Draft submission

1. The EU hereby submits its views on the agenda of the AWG-LCA at its fourteenth session, based on the latest version to date of the supplementary agenda (document FCCC/AWGLCA/2011/1/Add.4).

Mitigation

2. The EU requests that the two following agenda points be added to the agenda of the AWG-LCA at its fourteenth session:

4bis. Quantified economy-wide emission reduction targets to be implemented by Parties included in Annex I to the Convention;

4ter. Nationally appropriate mitigation actions to be implemented by Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention;

3. These points are crucially important and should be fully part of the discussions of the AWG-LCA in 2011.
4. Therefore the EU requests that these two points be included in the main section of the agenda, between the points “4. Adaptation Committee” and “5. Work programme on enhanced measurement, reporting and verification for Parties included in Annex I to the Convention” of document FCCC/AWGLCA/2011/1/Add.4.
5. These two points will allow for a space to continue discussions on mitigation in relation to both developed and developing countries in a balanced way, faithful to the Cancun Agreements (decision 1/CP.16) and the spirit of the Bali Action Plan.
6. These two points will also provide a space to include consideration of the level of ambition of mitigation with regard to the 2 degrees objective. In this context, the EU considers that the proposed point 4bis contains in substance the supplementary agenda point put forward by AOSIS “Options and ways to increase the level of ambition of developed country Parties economy-wide emission reduction targets” (point 17(c) of document FCCC/AWGLCA/2011/1/Add.4) which should therefore be deleted.

7. Furthermore the EU suggests that the following issues, which were left unresolved by the Cancún Agreements, are put on the agenda under the item “Any other matters”:

International aviation and maritime transport

8. In addition, the EU requests the inclusion of an agenda point on “International aviation and maritime transport” in the agenda. This issue, which was discussed since COP 13 in the context of the Bali Action Plan, could not be concluded upon in Cancun and discussions need to continue.

Agriculture

9. The EU expresses support for the inclusion of an agenda point on “Agriculture” as proposed by other Parties.

HFCs

10. Finally, the EU expresses its understanding that the issue of HFCs will be discussed as part of the agenda point on "non-market-based mechanisms" present in the agenda.
