Relevance of Physical Science Basis for UNFCCC Art. 2:

- The Copenhagen Accord proposes levels of climate change which suggest compliance with Art. 2 of the UNFCCC;
- WG I will assess information on climate change commitments, on irreversible changes, and on abrupt climate changes;
- WG I will continue to assess information on changes in mean and variability for major climate variables for a range of scenarios;
- This combined knowledge is essential for the assessment of risk performed in WG II and WG III;
- WG I will **not provide** an assessment of what constitutes "dangerous anthropogenic interference with the climate system".








Accelerating mass loss of both polar ice sheets identified by GRACE







Contributions of WG I to address issues related to Art. 2 and the Copenhagen Accord:

- Chapters 5, 6, and 12 specifically refer to abrupt changes and irreversibilities;
- Chapters 11 and 12 provide climate projections, Chapter 13 assesses comprehensively sea level, and Chapter 14 adresses the regional climate change;
- A hierarchy of models, ranging from EMICs to CCMs, will explore various emissions scenarios and "physics tests";
- Emphasis will be on communicating uncertaintiesusing a probabilistic approach where possible.
