

**Submission by Georgia to the AWG-LCA for incorporation into the draft co-facilitators texts on agenda items 3.3; 3.4; 3.5; and 4.**

Georgia is committed to a successful fourteenth session of the AWGLCA and considers the work of the AWGLCA as one of the critical components of a successful outcome in Durban.

Below is draft decision text submitted for incorporation into the draft co-facilitators' texts under Agenda items 3.3, 3.4, 3.5 and 4 of the fourteenth session of the AWGLCA and decision X/CP.17.

**Agenda item 3.3 – Enhanced action on adaptation: Adaptation Committee**

Decides that the Adaptation Committee shall have a majority from developing country Parties comprise 20/xx member, who shall serve in their personal capacity, and will be nominated by their respective groups or constituencies and elected by the Conference of the Parties, with the aim of achieving a fair, equitable and balanced representation, as follows:

Option 1 –

- (a) (x) members from Africa region
- (b) (x) members from Asia region
- (c) (x) members from Latin America and the Caribbean region
- (d) (x) members from Eastern Europe region
- (e) (x) members from Western Europe and Others region;

Option 2 – *(amend option as follows)*

- (a) 3/x members from Africa region
- (b) 3/x members from Asia region
- (c) 3/x members from Latin America and the Caribbean region
- (d) 2/x Non-Annex 1 country members from Eastern Europe region
- (e)

Option a:

6/x members from Annex I

Option b:

(x) Annex 1 members from Eastern Europe region

(x) members from Western Europe and Others region

(f) 1/x member from small island developing States

(g) 2/x member from least developed country Parties

Option 3 - *(amend option as follows)*

(a) 7x member from Parties included in Annex I to the Convention (Annex I Parties);

(b) 7/x members from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (non-Annex I Parties), representation shall include representatives of all relevant United Nations regional groupings, including Africa region, Asia region, Eastern Europe region, Latin America and Caribbean region.

And possibly

(c) 2 advisory members each from southern and northern civil society. These advisory members will not participate in consensus under paragraph 15 below;

### **Agenda item 3.4 – Finance**

#### COMPOSITION AND WORKING MODALITIES

Option 1 - *(as presented in co-facilitators text)*

- a. 2 representatives from each of the 5 UN regional groups
- b. 1 representative from small island developing States
- c. 1 representative from the least-developed country Parties
- d. 2 representative from Parties included in Annex I to the Convention
- e. 2 representative from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention

Option 2 - *(amend option as follows)*

- a. Six members from developed country Parties;
- b. Six members from developing country Parties, representation from developing country Parties shall include representatives of all relevant United Nations regional groupings, including Africa region, Asia region, Eastern Europe region, Latin America and Caribbean region

- c. Two members of civil society; and
- d. Two members from the private sector;

Option 3 – (*amend option as follows*)

Decides that the Standing Committee should consist of 24 members, comprising an equal number of members from developing and developed country Parties; representation from developing country Parties shall include representatives of all relevant United Nations regional groupings, including Africa region, Asia region, Eastern Europe region, Latin America and Caribbean region, and representatives of small island developing States and the least developed countries.

**Agenda item 3.5 – Technology development and transfer**

Decides to add to the composition of the Technology Executive Committee 2 expert members from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (non-Annex I Parties) from the Eastern Europe region, elected by the Conference of the Parties (COP), serving in their personal capacity and nominated by Parties with the aim of achieving a fair and balanced representation.

**Agenda item 4 - Review: further definition of its scope and development of modalities**

Decides that the Review Expert Body shall have 40 members, with 20 members from developed country Parties and 20 members from developing country Parties, with the following composition:

- (a) Four members from Africa region
- (b) Four members from Asia region
- (c) Four members from Latin America and Caribbean region
- (d) Three members from Eastern Europe region
- (e) Two members from small island developing States
- (f) Three members from least developed country Parties

The Review Expert Body shall have expertise, knowledge and skills, in the area of climate change science and mitigation.

Alt. The Review Expert Body shall be composed of 40 members, with 15 members being from developed country Parties and 25 members from developing country Parties, with the following composition

- (a) Six members from Africa region
- (b) Six members from Asia region
- (c) Six members from Latin America and Caribbean region

(d) Three members from Eastern Europe region

(e) Two members from small island developing States

(f) Two members from least developed country Parties

The members of the Review Expert Body shall have expertise, knowledge and skills in the area of climate change science, mitigation, adaptation and the observed impacts of climate change.
